Please join with me in congratulating the **Class of 2021**. We also salute their families, friends, and all those who have contributed to their success. Despite the circumstances this school year, through their commitment to academics, the arts, athletics and community service, this class has contributed greatly to our school's overall excellence. As evidence of this, *US News and World Report* recently ranked Spruce Creek High School as **one of the best high schools in Florida** and among the **top in the Nation**. **Graduation for the Class of 2021** will take place on **Saturday, June 5 at 12:30 pm** at the **Ocean Center**. End of School & Summer Reminders

Final exams for students in grades 9 – 11 will begin on **Tuesday, June 1** and conclude on **Friday, June 4**. For the first three days, **two exams will be given each day** with the final exam for the day concluding around noon. On **Friday, June 4 only one exam** will be administered and will conclude around 10:00 am. Students choosing to check-out after their last exam for the day will need to bring a *separate note for each day* containing the student's name, alpha ID, parent name, signature, and phone number. These notes are to be brought to the dean's office at the time of check-out. Students remaining on campus will follow the printed bell schedule for the day. School busses will pick-up and drop off at their regular times. *Students are reminded to return all textbooks, laptops, and clean out their lockers before leaving for the summer. Any items left in student lockers after June 4 will be discarded.*

For students that were not successful with one or more classes, please contact your school counselor for summer options to make-up those credits. These options may include **Volusia On-Line School**, the **Credit Recovery computer lab**, or **Florida Virtual School**. Other students may qualify for an **Algebra** or **Biology** review course during the **month of July**. Those students who *did not pass or take the Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, or United States History EOC exams* will have an opportunity to take those tests over the summer. Dates for these exams will be the week of **July 19**. Please contact **Mr. Kevin Clark**, our Summer School administrator, at **extension 37807** for more information about summer opportunities.

Please continue to check our website, listen for phone messages, and check your mailbox for important information during the summer months. *We are planning to mail home the final report card near the middle of June.* Included in that envelope will be important information regarding orientation for the **2021-22 school year**. The first day of school for all students will be on **Monday, August 16, 2021**.

During the summer, the **main office will be open Monday – Thursday from 8 am – 4 pm** and will close daily from **noon – 1:00 pm** for lunch. The guidance office will also have limited hours during the summer. Please be sure to **call the school ahead of time during the summer** to make an appointment to see a school counselor.

Soccer Summer Camp



The 5th Annual Creek Soccer Summer Camp will take place here on campus during the weeks of June 14-18 and 21-25. The camps will be directed by high school and college coaches, as well as varsity soccer players. Hours are from 9am-noon and campers can attend one or both of the weeks. The camps are open to boys and girls ages 7-17. The focus will be on developing players' technical, physical and tactical skills, as well as promoting teamwork and sportsmanship. 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Guidance News

Hello Hawk Families,

The end of the school year is fast approaching with many events and deadlines to come. Senior Volunteer Hours must be turned in at the Guidance office on or before **May 21st**. Freshman through Juniors must turn their hours in on or before **May 28th**. Remember, hours cannot be carried over into next year, so please turn them in by the deadline. Any college bound student that has taken Algebra 2 or higher should register for the SAT and/or ACT for college acceptance and to meet testing requirements for a Bright Futures Scholarship. If you qualify for free/reduced lunch, see the College & Career Counselor, Mr. Schafer, for SAT/ACT fee waivers. Also, make sure you are on track to complete two years of a foreign language (Ex.: French 1 and French 2) before the end of your Senior year. Please note that the deadline for taking the ACT/SAT for Seniors to meet Bright Futures requirements has been extended to December 1, 2021.

The SAT and ACT can also be used to earn concordant scores to meet high school graduation requirements if you have not already passed the FSA ELA and/or Algebra 1 EOC. Class of 2022 through 2024 are still required to pass the FSA ELA or get a concordant score to meet graduation requirements. Also, students must pass the Algebra 1 EOC or Geometry EOC or earn a concordant score.

Juniors should be working on volunteer hours, researching colleges, setting up summer college tours, or researching companies and working on their resumes for future employment after high school. Freshman and Sophomores, have you explored all the clubs, sports, and activities available at SCHS? Get involved! Finish the year strong with passing grades. Freshmen need at least 5 credits to roll up to 10th grade and Sophomores need at least 11 credits to be a Junior next year. Juniors will need 17 credits to roll up to a Senior.

If you need to remediate any courses you did not pass this year, talk to your Counselor about summer opportunities to get caught up with your credits. Summer A session will be from June 10th through June 30th. Summer B session runs from July 5th through July 29th. Geometry tutoring is now taking place every day after school in both B-6 (Mr. Davies' room) and B-13 (Ms. George's room.)

All students who are currently Dual Enrolled, please note that the Fall registration deadline is May 28th. Make sure you provide your School Counselor with a copy of your DSC schedule after you register for classes. If you are interested in learning more about Dual Enrollment, see Mr. Schafer, College and Career Counselor, to discuss eligibility and visit www.sprucecreekcounseling.weebly.com/dual-enrollment. You may also want to join our Remind classroom for info and reminders. The join code is: remind.com/join/d6b9aa. Please visit the counseling department website at www.sprucecreekcounseling.weebly.com throughout the year for other valuable information and updates. You may also request an appointment with your Counselor through the site.

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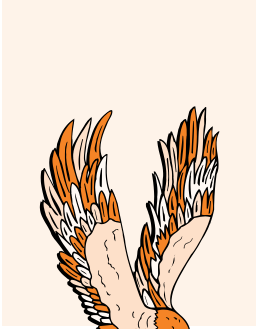


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Library Media Minutes

Your media center continues to be in the middle of things. During the school closure and hybrid reopening, we have remained accessible to students for books and technology support. We have served as the school help desk, checking out laptops (including the new 1:1 devices), webcams, textbooks, and hotspots to students who need them and walking students and parents through how to use Volusia Live technology while troubleshooting 1:1 laptop issues for students on campus.

Who Visits the Library? YOUR STUDENT!

With lower numbers of students on campus and more social distancing, our media center didn't feel quite as busy as it normally does, but we remained open to serve student needs from 8:00-4:00 daily. Even with significantly fewer students on campus due to virtual learning, the number of books we have checked out has remained consistent from first quarter last year. Students were excited to get back onto campus to be able to check out books!

Summer Recommended Reading Lists: Prevent Summer Brain Drain

For many students, summer becomes a time of relaxing and hanging out with friends. That is an important part of summer, but please encourage your student to spend some of their relaxation time reading! Just because they are growing up doesn't mean they don't need your guidance in reading. While the time for evening stories may be long gone, you can still engage in family trips to the public library and conversations about books at the dinner table. Take a trip to Barnes and Noble or Books-a-Million before a family road trip. Stock up on magazines. Spend time as a family where everyone is reading something of their choice. You can read the books from inside your browser or download the Destiny Read app to your phone or tablet. Your login is the same as your school login. 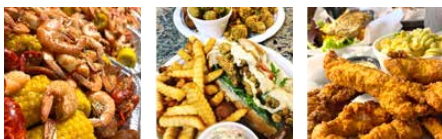

Laptop and Textbook Return

It is important for all students to return laptops, hotspots, and any textbooks they have checked out before summer to avoid charges. Check what you owe by visiting vPortal and clicking on the app for DESTINY.

Laptops must be returned with chargers and they must be cleaned off by the student before returning them. Take a wipe or damp (not wet) cloth and wipe down the whole device to remove all debris. Wipes will be provided in the media center for students to use if they do not do it before coming in. Students must also remove all stickers/tape before returning the device.

If you are registered for summer classes or are participating in specific academic reviews, come to the media center to renew your device or necessary textbooks or email shmurray@volusia.k12.fl.us if you are a virtual student. It will need to be returned at some point to have necessary software installed or it will not work after the summer.

The media center is open for returns from 8:00-3:45 May 21st-June 8th. The official schedule is:

- **Seniors:** May 21, 24, 25 anytime between 8:00-3:45. Everything must be in or paid for before graduation.
- **9th-11th Face to Face Students:** Laptops returned during English class on May 27th or 28th. Return textbooks whenever finished but before 3:45 on the last day of school. There will be time built into the semester exam schedule for locker clean-out and textbook return.
- **9th-11th Virtual Students:** We are open specifically for Volusia Live students to return between 8:00-3:45 June 7th and 8th to allow you to keep the device through the last day of school.
