Academy of Aviation and Aerospace




The Academy of Aviation and Aerospace is excited to announce that for the first time, we are offering two unique strands within the academy. Students can now choose between **Aviation Maintenance**, learning skills to prepare students for technical careers such as A&P (Airframe and Powerplant) Technician or Aviation Mechanic, or **Aerospace**

Studies, to prepare students for a future in engineering or pilot training. Both strands offer opportunities for students to train with Unmanned Aircrafts and earn industry certifications in the field.

We continue to partner with Embry Riddle Aeronautical University to offer 5 dualenrollment courses in Aeronautical Science, Unmanned Aircrafts, and Private Pilot. These courses count for high school and college credit, offering a savings of up to \$10,000 in college tuition.

Academy of Law and Homeland Security





Our academy students were excited to volunteer at the St Augustine Rotary Club for the second year in a row at their 26th annual Rhythm and Ribs Festival at Francis Field, downtown St Augustine, by monitoring 2 parking lots.

The Academy continues its dedication to the Florida Public Service Association and will be attending Regional and State Competitions in November and March, where they demonstrate skills such as Traffic Stops, Use of Force, 911 Dispatch, and Forensic Investigation. We will also be participating in the North Florida Criminal Justice Alliance competition in February.

We have also been invited to participate in the 67th annual St Augustine Christmas Parade on December 3rd. This will be our 2nd year attending, and we are in need of adult supervision, a float (truck or car pulling a small trailer) and candy donations.

Academy of Future Teachers



We are thrilled to have Ms. Lindsey join the Teaching Academy team as our new TA3: Foundations of Curriculum instructor! Our students are off to an early and outstanding start with field experience for the 2022-23 school year. TA1, 2, and 3 classes have partnered with FCTC's Tech Tots program to study and practice Early Childcare. All students have an opportunity to visit their campus at least once a week.

We have established a new model for the 4th year of our program. We now have 10 seniors participating in Dual Enrollment courses through St Johns River State College and University of North Florida. They

are also participating in a local internship two days a week, where they learn from a mentor teacher in Middle School and Elementary classrooms within St Johns County School District. Students who do not choose dual enrollment are registered at First Coast Technical College Early Childhood Care Program. They have authentic learning experiences daily as they prepare for a career after graduation.

The Academy continues to have a strong chapter in the Florida Future Educators of America. The student organization meets weekly to plan for the upcoming conference and competition. We will be hosting a school-based competition for all members before the end of the Fall Semester. Winners will have the opportunity to bring their projects to the state competition in February.



A Graduate Once... AN ALUMNI FOREVER

THE ST. AUGUSTINE/KETTERLINUS HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION STARTED IN ANSWER TO A REQUEST...

It began with a phone call from then SAHS Principal Paula Steele to current President Brad Davis, asking him to create an alumni group for the school. The association officially launched in 1997, with founding board members Joseph Boles Jr., Martha Hasty, Suzanne Russell, Jonah Ash, Lola Ponce, Carrie (Zebrowski) Cooper and Brad Davis. Principal Steele had a great idea

as not all schools have such an organization.

THE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION AND IT'S MEMBERS DO SEVERAL THINGS: FIRST, RAISE MONEY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS FOR DESERVING SENIORS.

The high school officially opened in 1910 as St. Augustine High School. The name was changed in 1928 to The Elizabeth Ketterlinus High School to recognize the land contribution made by Elizabeth Ketterlinus. In 2010 (the 50Th anniversary celebration of the current location of the high school) St. Augustine High School went back to its original name. This was also the 100th anniversary of the opening of KHS.

The scholarship effort intensified in 2013 with the launch of the Jackets Forever Endowment Fund. Its goal of a \$200,000 endowment is halfway realized. You can help us get the rest of the way there by donating today. **SECOND, MENTORSHIP OF SAHS STUDENTS.**

That takes many forms but as part of joining the Hall of Fame, all inductees are asked to go into the classroom and share why they were chosen, and how they applied their skills from high school to achieve success in life.

THE HISTORY OF OUR SCHOOLS

A RALLES

1901

SAHS began in 1901 when the school boar decided it would soon move the overcrowded Public School Number 1 from Hospital St. (later renamed Aviles)



1910

The new St. Augustine High School, would be Oconstructed on the old Spanish moat, 40 Orange St.(Cubo Line & City Gates)



1928

After a donation of land at the corner of Mulvey and Orange Streets, Ketterlinus High School opened..



1954

KHS used nearby Francis Field for its football games, including during its 1954 undefeated season under Coach Walt Slater.



1960

The current St. Augustine High School opened on Varella Ave. in 1960. At that time, KHS became a junior high, and was integrated in 1970.
