




Jacket Hub

The academy is currently planning several field studies and has been invited to 3 different criminal justice competitions within The State of Florida. In late October, we will be hosting the Fall Games for the North Florida Criminal Justice Alliance on our campus.

Our Academy continues to grow larger in number of students each year. Our Officers this year are as follows: Chief-Henry Maddox, Asst Chief-Kayla Martinez, Lt-Giselle Borbon, Chaplin- Alexander Harris, Captain- Claire Knoblaux, Corporal- Landon Gwaltney, Clerk- Kora Petty, Inventory Clerk- Makhiya Stanley. The students can be seen around school wearing their matching dark green Polo shirts with our Emblem on them. This year, they have a little extra symbol to them to signify the different grade levels. Guests from the industry are always welcome and continue to speak with our students throughout the school year.

We are proud to announce brand-new Dual Enrollment courses for Juniors and Seniors inside our program. "Introduction to Criminal Justice" and "Police and Society" are taught through St Johns River State College. They are a part of the Law and Homeland Security Career Certificate Program. These courses are taught on our St Augustine High School campus, and students earn college credit with their completion. We are very excited for the possibilities and opportunities for our students this year!



Academy of Aviation and Aerospace

The Academy of Aviation and Aerospace welcomes Captain Charles Boswell as an Aerospace teacher. Capt. Boswell was an airline pilot for 39 years and he is excited about sharing his experiences with the students.

The Academy of Aviation and Aerospace is in its second year of the new Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA) curriculum tailored to high school students. We have kicked off the year with topics ranging from UAS operation, materials used to build aircraft, weather, and how it affects pilots in the air. Some of the classes have enjoyed their first experience with a simulator and a drone!

Advanced curriculum will be focused how pilots plan for weather before departure, enroute, and arrival at their airports. Students will learn how to plan flights, read aviation maps, and ensure their aircraft remains in safe, flyable conditions.

Students can then apply what they have learned on one of the virtual trainers in the classroom "hangar." "The Hangar" has various simulation options, including a Gleim Virtual Cockpit that gives students a 120-degree screen view with realistic flight controls for a student to apply practical application to classroom lessons. Students have also used gained knowledge through paper airplane design and testing.

The Aerospace Club had its first meeting on August 28. It was so exciting to see the number of new freshmen that attended. Time was focused on forming a mission statement, assessing the existing equipment, and issues like t-shirts and possible field trips. Please see Schoology for a QR code to join!

Gaetz Aerospace, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University provides high school students with an opportunity to explore aerospace courses with a focus on small Unmanned Aircraft Systems and Private Pilot Ground school, taught by a college professor from ERAU. Both courses provide a direct path to Federal Aviation Administration licensing, as well as additional corporate credentials through the Unmanned Safety Institute. Each course, if successfully completed, awards three college semester hours. These courses can be requested by students beginning in their sophomore year with the possibility of obtaining 17 semester hours with ERAU. Those credit hours can be transferred to any college on an official transcript from ERAU.

Aside from the opportunity to receive college credit from an elite aeronautical university, the hands-on portion of each course includes simulator and unmanned aircraft (drone) flights. As the student progresses through the more advanced courses, the hands-on exercises become more intricate in preparation for real world opportunities. If the student is deemed prepared for the FAA exam, ERAU will pay the \$175 exam fee (UAS pilot or Private Pilot Ground exam). This will put a student ahead of their peers if they choose to continue an aviation career.

The courses utilize multiple modes of instruction; lecture, simulator, hands-on, computer-based training, and team exercises. Do not miss out on the chance to accumulate college credit and a great experience with Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University!





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Academy of Future Teachers

St. Augustine High School's Academy of Future Teachers paves the way for future generations. It prepares high schoolers for a career in Education. Starting the 2023-24 school year, our students have a new progression of practicum and internship experience. Freshmen learn an overview of the teaching profession as well as a deep dive

into Exceptional Education. They work internally with the St. Augustine High School ESE Department observing and assisting inside classrooms. Sophomores focus on Human Growth and Development and gain field experience at First Coast Technical College's early learning program: Tech Tots. Junior year, our students become immersed in curriculum planning and classroom management. They complete miniature internships inside middle school classrooms at St Johns Technical High School and visit Education Classes at Flagler College. Senior year, our students complete their capstone internship within St Johns County School District. They are assigned a mentor teacher to visit daily, where they learn through on-the-job training in a classroom. Seniors are also preparing for the FCTE Professional Educators Exam and can graduate high school with their certification. This certificate is an essential step towards teaching in the state of Florida. Students in the academy are also exposed to a variety of volunteer work, guest speakers, and more to ensure they are ready for the world after high school. Even if the students do not want to pursue teaching, our program teaches life skills such as public speaking and organization, useful in any career pathway!



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Army Junior ROTC

The Jacket Battalion is off to a running start! We want to take the time to welcome our new Army Instructor, Sergeant Major (Retired) Coy Wyche. He brings a wealth of knowledge and energy to the Cadets of the Yellow Jacket Battalion. SGM Wyche joins us from Englewood High School in Duval County. His concentration will be Leadership, Education, and Training (LET) Level 1 while coaching the Drill Team and Color Guard.

The Corps of Cadets are quickly settling into the year with numerous projects planned. Cadet Battalion Command c/LTC Moria Kimker will deliver her initial guidance to the battalion staff, laying out her expectations and goals for the forthcoming school year. The Jacket Battalion's focus will be on retention and recruitment. This year's other projects are a service-learning Project, community service, athletic competitions, establishing a drone team, and planning our first Cadet Ball. The service-learning project will focus on the US Flag retirement process. This project will create a donation box for residents to drop off their worn-out flags for proper retirement by JROTC Cadets.

New to JROTC this year is the addition of a dual-enrollment program. Instructed by CW5 Chris Braund (SAHS JROTC Senior Army Instructor), this program, sponsored by Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, allows JROTC Cadets the opportunity to learn from a college-credentialed professor in their high school environment and earn college elective credits. Currently, the program offers two different courses, SS130: Aviation History in America and SS321: U.S. Military History 1900-Present. The program hopes to expand next school year, allowing qualifying JROTC Cadets to earn up to twelve (12) college credits.

JROTC Athletics are also in full swing. The Raider Team has begun training for the season with their first meet against other JROTC programs in late September. Raider team members prepare for five events: one-rope bridge, tire flip, 5K team run, cross-country rescue, and a Raider fitness challenge. The physically demanding co-curricular team emphasizes clean living, ethical values, goal setting, leadership potential, effective communication, and positive self-motivation.

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
