ABSENCES

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call or written excuse (from the parent must be emailed to StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org.), is required to be sent within 48 hours of the absence. The email should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent telephone number. A parent may excuse 5 days in a semester. Further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.

All volunteers must be in the PSCB volunteer database and have been background checked and approved. It takes 10 minutes to fill out the PCSB electronic volunteer registration form. Please talk to your family, work associates, and friends to help give back to our community by becoming a volunteer.

If you find your volunteer profile is inactive, you must reactivate your profile in the volunteer database PRIOR to volunteering/mentoring. Due to the Covid pandemic, volunteers are NOT allowed on campus during normal school hours for the remainder of this school year. All mentoring is done virtually.

You can update your personal information and log out in the lower righthand corner of the screen. Do NOT re-activate using any mobile device. To do so may inadvertently answer the criminal offense questions incorrectly, which would delay your clearance.

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SUMMER BRIDGE CLASSES

High School Summer Bridge Programs will be held from 8:00am to 12:00pm, Monday through Thursday on the dates below... All Summer Bridge/Credit Recovery courses will be offered Face-to-Face, NO virtual courses will be available. Transportation will be available to any student who needs it.

- Algebra 1 Course Retake AND Alg 1 EOC retake Prep- June 21st to July 15th
 This program is for all rising 10th, 11th and 12th grade students who need to retake Algebra 1 course for
 grade forgiveness and/or to earn course credit AND rising 10th grader who did NOT pass the Algebra 1
 EOC and who will retake it on July 14th and 15th this summer.
- ACT Math Prep June 21st to July 15th

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This program is for rising 11th and 12th graders who need to prepare to pass the ACT Math test for graduation or any other rising 11th/12th graders who would like help to improve their ACT Math score. Students will have the opportunity to take the ACT on Sat., July 17th at no cost to them here at SPHS.

- ACT Read/ELA Prep June 21st to July 15th
 This program is for rising 11th and 12th graders who need to prepare to pass the ACT Read/ELA test for graduation or any other rising 11th/12th graders who would like help to improve their ACT Read/ELA score. Students will have the opportunity to take the ACT on Sat., July 17th at no cost to them here at SPHS.
- Credit Recovery (core academic subjects) June 21st (14th for current seniors) to July 18th
 This program is for current 9-12 grade students who have failed a core academic course that is required for
 graduation. Students who need to recover credits use a program called APEX, which allows them to make
 up failed courses at their own pace, so they can get back on track to graduate.

The purpose of the summer program is to provide learning opportunities during the summer so students who have assessment scores that indicate they are struggling in reading and mathematics will be on a stronger path to success when the 2021-22 school year begins. It is also imperative that students who are behind in credits and are in danger of being retained at the end of summer if they do not make up failed courses attend our Summer Bridge/Credit Recovery programs as well.


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ART AWARDS

DROP-OFF & PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Thank you to all the parents who are using the Devil's Drive Car Line to drop your students off in the morning and to pick them up in the afternoon. Student safety is our number one priority and using this designated area ensures that all students are out of harm's way.

Please DO NOT enter the student parking lot to drop off your child. Students who are dropped off in the student parking lot will receive a detention. If you want to avoid the car line in the morning, you may want to consider turning on to 7th Avenue from 28th Street and dropping students off along the sidewalk on 7th Avenue to cross Devil's Drive at the crosswalk by Portable 1. We do not recommend dropping students off across the street from the school and please do not stop on 5th Avenue and let your child out of the car.

The safe drop-off and pick-up locations are the car circle by Devil's Drive on 27th St. off 5th Ave. as well as 28th St. and 7th Ave.

Did you know that if the school sends you a letter it will NOT be forwarded to your new address? Please do the following steps to change your address:

TESTING, TESTING, TESTING

The state of Florida has determined testing "windows" for End of Course Assessments. Students who are enrolled in: US History, Biology, Algebra 1, or Geometry will be taking an EOC. Students will be notified of the date, time, and location for each test that they are taking. It is vital that students show up on time and put forth their best effort on their exams. Parents can support their students by encouraging them and making sure that they are well rested and on time.

SPC DUAL ENROLLMENT

Students who are doing part-time Dual Enrollment on SPHS' campus and/ or at St. Petersburg College campus next year must have an unweighted 3.00 GPA, required test scores, and obtain an SPC ID. For classes at SPC, registration paperwork must be completed. Please contact your counselor for more information.

STUDENTS' DELIVERY OF FLOWERS, BALLOONS, ETC.

With safety in mind, the school cannot accept any type of flower arrangement, balloon bouquets or balloon arrangements for delivery to students. Many times, these gifts are in glass containers which can be broken. In addition, they cause class disruption. Please do not send any type of delivery to students here at school. 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NEED TO USE THE ELEVATOR?

If you ever need to use the elevator at school, you will need to bring in a doctor's note stating how long the elevator will be required. Before the elevator key is issued the student will have to put down a \$20.00 deposit that will be returned by check in the mail once the key is returned. Elevator keys can be obtained in the bookkeeping office.

Pinellas County Schools Transportation Department is implementing a new system to inform you when your child's bus is going to be delayed or schedule changes. If your student rides the bus this is important to read. SPHS is part of a pilot effort to use a system called Bus Bulletin.

The Bus Bulletin notification system will notify parents and students when there are bus delays and schedule changes. If you would like to receive instant notifications when delays or incidents affect your student's bus, please register with Bus Bulletin.

- There is no cost to you for this service.
- Registration is simple and fast.
- You can choose to receive either text messages, phone calls, and e-mails or all these options.
- All contact information is stored securely and will not be shared or sold. Your privacy is protected.
- Please note: this system is not related to Pinellas County Schools new emergency text message communications through School Messenger.

Seniors must have their completed forms turned in to their school counselor by **May 17th** so that the information can be recorded. Seniors who qualify and have applied for Bright Futures will be notified of their award status late July or early August for the Fall semester. All other students who have completed their hours are asked to follow the same May 17th due date.

Students who would like to start their community service hours over the summer break are asked to email/check-in with their school counselor. Please have the pre-approval forms turned in by May 17th for approval.

Credit Recovery

APEX after school and on Saturday morning is an option for students needing to recover D's and F's in core academic graduation requirement courses. The hours are from 9am-12pm every Saturday and there are 3 certified teachers available for APEX classes or free tutoring. Students can attend after school on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays 1:30pm - 3:30pm with Mr. Elder (Rm. 01 - 150); Mr. White (04 - 215); Mr. Walker (04 - 303); Mr. Beam (04 - 308). There is also an option to join virtually through Canvas.

Awards Night

Our annual Awards Night will be virtual this year. More information to come in the following weeks – stay tuned!

Course Registration

Please check with your student to verify that they have submitted their course requests for next year's schedule. If a request has not been submitted, courses will be chosen for the student. Changes will not be made after the last day of school (June 9th) and there will not be a "Schedule Change Process" in August. Schedules will only be corrected for conflicts, missing courses, and/or graduation requirements. Corrections will NOT be made for any of the following reasons:

- Change of mind about course(s) selected at registration, including alternate course selections
- Personal opinion as to the difficulty of the course
- Desire to have the class at a more convenient time
- Teacher preference
- Concern that the course will negatively affect GPA

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CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Parents requesting early check-out of their student can send an email to middletonia@ pcsb.org or call the school for the student to get a Permit to Leave slip. This alleviates any wait time for you when you come to pick up your student. If you come in, please understand that we do need time to get your student for you. Please allow at least 30 minutes. This will give the school the opportunity to look up the student's schedule and send for them to meet you in the front office. Parents, it is important that we check the driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school. This will be done to ensure the safety of your child. After 1:00 pm there will be no permission to leave slips written, due to the time constraints on using the proper method of getting your child from class.

DISTRACTED DRIVING AWARENESS

There are three types of distracted driving: cognitive, manual and visual distractions.

Cognitive: thinking about anything but the task at hand-driving.

Manual: your hands off the wheel while driving.

<u>Visual</u>: your eyes off the road while driving.

Actions have consequences: this is something that you learned growing up. Whether the consequences are good or bad depends upon the action you take. Texting while driving; for instance, uses all the above types of distractions and has potentially fatal, as well as citation/ticketing consequences. In 2018, 2,841 people died due to distracted driving. As of January 1, 2020, the state of Florida made it legal for police officers to ticket a driver for using a handheld device while driving.

Everyone has a choice when you turn on your car and shift it into drive to put your phone down. Nothing is more important than your life and the lives of others around you. Driving without distractions is the best choice you can make.
