PROPOSALS FOR A MORE SUSTAINABLE SCHOOL

Students in Mrs. Torres' Spanish 6 Higher Level class completed a unit about sustainability. The main goal was for students to reflect on how they could personally reduce their ecological footprint. With this goal in mind, the students were challenged to write a proposal (an IB text format) on how to make our school more sustainable and eco-friendlier. Each student wrote an individual proposal and then they were grouped by fives to come up with only four proposals. The objective was for them to learn how to negotiate their personal opinions/proposals and decide on the top 2-3 ideas most likely to be adopted/selected by our school Principal Darlene Lebo.

Proposals included ideas such as carpooling, bicycling to school, recycling plastic, using Led lightbulbs in the classrooms or natural day light, having a compost, growing some vegetables at school, using cardboard trays in the cafeteria, and even solar panels! All ideas had to include an associated cost, suggest where the funds would come from and the responsible party. For the most part, students recommended the school clubs to be active participants in this ecological effort.

28' TINY HOME TO BE SOLD IN MARCH

Our Center for Construction Technologies students have been working hard on completing our 28' Tiny Home capstone project and will be selling it in late March at the St. Petersburg Tiny Home festival, or earlier if we have an interested buyer. The purpose for this project is to provide the 125 students in our program with project-based hands-on experiences and to raise money for our program's materials, field trips, and student scholarship needs.



Our students have partnered with local contractors and suppliers, provided through our wonderful and generous partnership with the Tampa Bay Builders Association, to build the 313 sq. ft. structure that includes a triple 7,000 lb. axle trailer with LED lights and power lift jack, steel stud framing, a standing-seam metal roof, LP Smartside exterior siding, PGT windows, LED interior lighting, 7.5" width Mohawk engineered oak flooring, Cambria countertops, Delta fixtures, interior shiplap siding, high-end appliances and more! This tiny home is considered

BUS INFORMATION

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STUDENT OBLIGATIONS

2019-20 DRESS CODE

TOPS:

- Collared shirt (pullover or button-up)
- St. Pete H.S. approved club or athletic t-shirt.
- All pullovers, sweaters, sweatshirts, jackets and hoodies (if hooded, hood may NOT be worn) must have appropriate shirt underneath (see above).
- All tops must be worn as intended and not tied up, or altered in any way. You may not wear sheer, mesh, oversized (cannot extend below the wrist when arms are held at your side) or undersized (must extend below waistline) tops. Low cut tops are NOT acceptable. Shoulders, stomachs, and backs must be covered.

BOTTOMS:

- All pants/jeans/shorts/skirts must be worn at the waist and be at least knee length or longer. All pants/jeans must be hemmed and/or cuffed. SPHS athletic team issued warm ups may be worn with SPHS approved t-shirt or collared shirt underneath.
- Athletic/Gym shorts are not permitted outside of gym class.
- Absolutely NO form fitting or spandex bottoms skirts, leggings, jeggings, and sweat pants, tights, yoga pants, etc. No knitted, nylon, or athletic style pants/shorts.

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS: Students who would like to earn community service hours need to come to 221 and pick up the pre-approval form prior to starting their volunteering experience. CREDIT RECOVERY: Credit recovery is available on Saturday mornings in the Media Center via APEX for ALL STUDENTS. Hours are from 9am – 12pm. Students can also work on APEX during lunch (11:42 – 12:17) in the Academic Resource Center (ARC) Monday – Friday. Athletes should check with their counselor regarding credit recovery that aligns with NCAA eligibility requirements.

COLLEGE VISITS: Juniors and seniors looking for their "perfect fit" for higher education are encouraged to take college visits. They should go to the Front Office to pick up and fill out a TDE form PRIOR to the trip. Proof of the visit must be provided to Ms. Middleton in the Front Office upon return to receive an excused absence. A total of 4 "College Days" are allowed. For IB students, please pick up your TDE from Ms. Derrickson in the IB Office.

PSAT FOLLOW UP: All 9th, 10th, 11th graders took the PSAT on October 16, 2019. The scores are available now online and can be accessed following the directions listed below. Counselors will be following up with students during classroom visits in January.

- Go to studentscores.collegeboard.org.
- Click "Sign Up" under the Sign In spaces.
- Input your personal information under "Create Your Student Account."
 - > Once students have set up their College Board account, they will need to log in to the account to access score information. Students should enter their username and password (at studentscores.collegeboard.org). They will be redirected to their SAT Suite of Assessments score-reporting portal, with their most recent test showing first.
 - > If their most recent test is missing, they can use the "Missing Scores" link to update their personal information and provide their access code or student ID that will match their scores to their account.
- When students log in to their College Board account, they will be taken to a dashboard (entry) screen that includes their scores, links to SAT practice. AP and core course work, and information about Student Search Service and career profiles.
- The first thing they will see on the dashboard is their most recent scores. The total score for PSAT/NMSQT ranges from 320 to 1520. It is the sum of their Math section score added to their Evidence-Based Reading and Writing section score. When students click "View Details," they will be taken to their detailed score reports.

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DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM AT ST. PETERSBURG COLLEGE

St. Petersburg College offers college classes to qualified high school students in Pinellas County at no cost to the student. These courses allow students to earn credits toward a high school diploma and a college degree. Dual enrollment course grades are recorded to the student's high school transcript and his/her permanent college transcript. Therefore, students must give their best performance in dual enrollment coursework because the resulting grades can greatly impact post-secondary education opportunities, scholarship opportunities, and financial aid eligibility.

Courses on the Dual Enrollment Approved Course List are available on SPC campuses and some local high school campuses. Dual enrollment courses that are offered by a credentialed instructor at a student's high school must be taken on the high school campus.

To take Dual Enrollment classes through SPC during the first semester, students must:

- See their school counselor to see if they qualify and obtain an ID number for SPC.
- Take the PERT, SAT, or ACT prior to obtaining permission to take dual enrollment courses.
- Students eligible for on campus Dual Enrollment courses will have an
 opportunity to register for on campus dual enrollment courses during the
 in-house registration in the month of February. Please see your School
 Counselor for more information regarding eligibility requirements for
 Dual Enrollment.
- 4. Obtain a completed Dual Enrollment Permission Form (for off campus classes.)
- Register for the class(es) through the SPC Dual Enrollment Office (for off campus classes) no later than one week after the last day of school.
- To be eligible to take an academic dual enrollment course a student must have a minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 3.0. To be eligible to take a career dual enrollment course, a student must have a minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 2.0.

EARLY COLLEGE/EARLY ADMISSION: Students who are interested in being a full-time Early College or Early Admission student must complete the application and submit to the Early College Program office by **2:00pm on February 10, 2020.**

Full-time EARLY COLLEGE OR EARLY ADMISSION STUDENTS must follow steps 1 – 3 listed above to enroll. Also, students eligible for EA/ECP will receive an information meeting notice form SPC. Interested students should visit SPC website – www.spcollege.edu for more information.

DUAL ENROLLMENT AT PINELLAS TECHNICAL COLLEGE

High school students attending Pinellas Technical College (PTC) have the opportunity to be dual enrolled in post-secondary courses tuition free! These courses give students credits toward a high school diploma and a career technical certificate. Hours completed at PTC may also transfer as credit hours to local and state colleges.



Dual enrollment students will be present in the same class as adult students; therefore, a higher level of maturity, independence, and initiative is important for student success.

Students who are registered for dual enrollment courses will have three grades per semester recorded on their high school transcript. Therefore, students will need to work hard and commit to academic excellence as they perform at their best with the required PTC coursework. Please keep in mind that the resulting grades can greatly impact postsecondary education opportunities and/or scholarship opportunities.

In order to take Dual Enrollment classes at PTC during the fall and spring semester, students must:

- Be at least 16 years old and entering their junior or senior year in high school
- Have a minimum cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.0, or 2.5 GPA for medical-related programs
- Show responsibility through high school attendance and behavior.
- Obtain a Dual Enrollment Application from their high school counselor.
- Return completed application to their high school counselor, with all necessary signatures. *Once the PTC counselor has received the application, the student will be contacted regarding a shadowing date.

ABSENCES

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call or written excuse from the parent, is required within 48 hours of the absence. Parents may also send an email to excuse their student's absence to StPetersburgHS. Absence@pcsb.org. A written excuse should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent telephone number. A parent may excuse 5 days in a semester. Further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.



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NEED TO USE THE ELEVATOR?

If you ever need to use the elevator at school, you will need to bring in a doctor's note stating how long the elevator will be required. Before the elevator key is issued the student will have to put down a \$20.00 deposit that will be returned by check in the mail once the key is returned. Elevator keys can be obtained in the bookkeeping office.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Thank you to all the parents who are using the Car Line to drop your students off in the morning and to pick them up in the afternoon. Student safety is our number one priority and using this designated area ensures that all students are out of harm's way.

Please <u>DO NOT</u> enter the Student Parking Lot or the Faculty Parking Lot to drop off your child. The safe drop-off and pick-up locations are the car circle by Devil's Drive on 27th St. off 5th Ave. as well as 28th St. and 7th Ave. Working together we can keep St. Pete High safe!

CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Parents requesting early check-out of their student can write a note and the student can go to the Front Office Room 110, that morning to get a Permit to Leave slip. This alleviates any wait time for you when you come to pick up your student. If you call or come in, please understand that we do need time to get your student for you. Please allow at least 30 minutes. This will give the school the opportunity to look up the student's schedule and send for them to meet you in the front office. Parents, it is important that we check the driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school. This will be done to ensure the safety of your child. After 1:30 pm there will be no permission to leave slips written, due to the time constraints on using the proper method of getting your child from class.
