FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH INFORMATION

Pinellas County Schools Food Service Application for Free and Reduced-Price Meals is needed for the 2023-2024 school year.

- ***REMINDER: Breakfast is available every day at NO CHARGE to ALL students.
- Federal regulations require a new application be submitted each school year.
- Free or reduced meals are not permitted without a processed application. This includes Food Stamps/TANF.
- You can complete an application at www.myschoolapps.com.
- Notification of status (Free, Reduced Price, or Paid) will be emailed or will be sent home with your child.
- Incomplete applications will delay processing.
- If you have any questions about the Free and Reduced Meal Program, please call the Food Service Office at (727) 547-7151.
- If you need to put money on your child's meal account go to www.myschoolbucks.com.
- Parents will need to have an application on file to get discounts for after school care, rec centers, clothes for kids, and scholarship programs.





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COUNSELORS' CORNER

SENIORS: During early fall, counselors will conduct Senior Seminars where students will receive a copy of their transcript, financial aid information, things seniors need to know, go over graduation requirements and post-grad options. Seniors need to match their Naviance accounts to their Common App accounts as this will ensure a smooth application process. It's imperative for college bound seniors to take either the ACT or SAT for college entrance, scholarships, or to determine college readiness. Test dates and test sites fill up quickly so it's important for students to complete their registrations ASAP.

Seniors should use the summer to determine when application deadlines are for their prospective colleges and universities. Then they can establish a schedule for themselves to be prepared to meet these deadlines.

Seniors who wish to take college visits will need to pick up the appropriate paperwork in the Main Office at least 3 days prior to the visit. Signed documentation of the visit will need to be presented to personnel in the Main Office upon completion of the visit.

JUNIORS: Juniors are encouraged to register and pay for the PSAT/NMSQT which will be administered in October at SPHS. Specific date of the PSAT/NMSQT will be announced in August. Students are to bring a check made out to St. Petersburg High School or the exact change. Students taking the PSAT will have the opportunity to become more aware of SAT directions and questions. The Student Search Service provides students the opportunity to receive information from colleges and universities. Students will be able to enter scholarship competition from the National Merit Corporation.

Juniors are also encouraged to start the college search process. College visits may start during second semester of their junior year. See above information.

Juniors who have not passed the FSA/ELA may use concordant scores from the ACT or SAT in its place.

SOPHOMORES AND FRESHMEN: Please note that all sophomores and freshmen will be taking the PSAT in October to help determine college readiness. There will be no charge for their participation.

INFORMATION FOR ALL STUDENTS PURSUING A BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP: Students who hope to qualify for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program must complete work or volunteer hours. DRESS CODE FOR 2023-24

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All clothing must be appropriately sized, securely fastened and cover midriff, back, sides, and all undergarments at all times. For example, suspenders should be over the shoulders, pants secured at the waist, belts buckled, no underwear as outerwear, no underwear exposed.

- Clothing must cover the body from one armpit across to the other armpit and down to mid-thigh. All tops must have sleeves and cover the entire shoulder.
- Rips, holes, or tears in clothing must be below mid-thigh.
- See-through, revealing, or mesh garments must not be worn without appropriate coverage underneath that meets the minimum requirements of this dress code.
- Gang paraphernalia, garments and/or jewelry, tattoos, or other insignias, which display or suggest sexual, vulgar, drug, alcohol, or tobacco-related wording/graphics or may tend to provoke violence or disruption in school shall not be worn.
- Clothing must not state, imply, or depict hate speech or imagery targeting groups based on race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, religious affiliation, or any other characteristics protected by federal or state law or Board policy.
- Any articles of clothing or jewelry that may cause injury including, but not limited to, items with spikes, or sharp objects, wallet chains, and heavy link chains are not allowed.
- Students must wear shoes that are safe and appropriate for the learning environment. Inappropriate footwear includes, but is not limited to, roller skates, skate shoes, and bedroom slippers.
- Form fitting leotard/spandex type clothing is not allowed unless proper outer garments cover to mid-thigh length or longer.
- Clothing and footwear traditionally designed as sleepwear shall not be worn.
- Head gear, including but not limited to, caps, hats, bandanas, sweatbands and/or sunglasses shall not be worn indoors on campus unless permitted by the principal for religious or medical reasons. Students may wear sunglasses, hats, or other sun-protective wear while outdoors during school hours, however these articles must not violate this dress code. **St. Petersburg High School t-shirts are always**

encouraged and welcomed to show your school spirit!



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
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POLICIES/PROCEDURES

MEDICATION INFORMATION

All students that plan to carry and self-administer an inhaler, epi-pen, pancreatic enzymes, or diabetic medication must have an Authorization to Carry form per PCSB medication policy. Physician and parent signatures are required. The forms are available in Student Services, room 1-135, or contact the school nurse.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Thank you to all the parents who are using the car line to drop your students off in the morning and to pick them up in the afternoon. Student safety is our number one priority and using this designated area ensures that all students are out of harm's way.

Please <u>DO NOT</u> enter the Student Parking Lot or the Faculty Parking Lot to drop off your child. Please <u>do not stop</u> on 5th Avenue and let your child out of the car.

The safe drop-off and pick-up locations are the car circle by Devil's Drive on 27th St. off 5th Ave. and 28th St. and 7th Ave.

VIRTUAL ID BADGE TO CHECK OUT TEXTBOOKS

Have the student go to the App store on their cell phone and download the Pinellas County School App. It is a free App. This is what the App looks like...



Open the App and have the student log in with their R2D2 number. Once in App they can pull up their student ID. This is called the Virtual ID Badge. If they had a photo taken they will see a photo and barcode, if not, they will just see a barcode.

Have the students screen shot their Virtual ID Badge and save it to their photos on their cell phone. They will need this Virtual ID Badge to check out textbooks, laptops and for tardies.

DELIVERY OF FLOWERS, BALLOONS, ETC.

With safety in mind, the school cannot accept any type of flower or balloon arrangements for delivery to students. Many times, these gifts are in glass containers which can be broken. In addition, they cause class disruption. Please do not send any type of delivery to students here at school. They will be refused and sent back to the sender. Your understanding and cooperation are greatly appreciated.

NEED TO USE THE ELEVATOR?

If you ever need to use the elevator at school, you will need to bring in a doctor's note stating how long the elevator will be required. Before the elevator key is issued the student will have to make a \$20.00 deposit that will be returned by check in the mail once the key is returned. Elevator keys can be obtained in the bookkeeping office.

PARKING HANG TAG 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

We do have some student parking spots left in our lot for sale. YOU MUST HAVE YOUR FULL LICENSE, not a learner's permit. The cost will be \$6.00, and you will need to bring exact change. You will also need to bring a copy of your driver license and registration that we can keep. We do not make copies. Our summer hours for parking tags are Monday through Thursday from 9:00am to 2:00pm.

COLLEGE VISITS FOR SENIORS

Do you plan on visiting a college? If so, you must stop by the Guidance Office in Building 1 room 221 and pick up a College TDE form. You will need to have all your teachers and a parent/guardian sign the form; return it to Building 1 Room 221 three days prior to your visit. Make sure to read the directions on the TDE. You will need to bring back a letter on letterhead from the college you visited, stating the date you attended. The letter will need to be turned in to Building 1 Room 221 within two days of your return. Your absence will then be corrected. College visits do not count as an absence for exam exemptions. **ABSENCES**

If your child is absent from school, the fastest way to get their absence to be excused is to email **StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org** within 48 hours of the absence. The email should include the student's name, reason for absence, the date of the absence/s and parent's telephone number (if your student is in IB please mention it in the email). A parent may excuse five days in a semester; further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.

UPDATING INFORMATION IN FOCUS/ONLINE FORMS

It's very important that we have the most current information for your student. This includes correct address, phone number, email and contact numbers. Please update your address, phone number, and/or email address by logging into the Student Reservation System with your Parent Username/password off of the www.pcsb.org website. If your address has changed please email your 2 proofs of residency along with your student's name to fowlerti@ pcsb.org or meltonp@pcsb.org. Also, when you login to FOCUS you will be prompted to complete the first day of school forms(Parent Acknowledgement of Student Code of Conduct, Media Release, Directory Information Optional Opt-Out, Network/Internet Acceptable Use Agreement, Technology Equipment Acceptance and Responsibility, Residency Questionnaire, School-Based Healthcare Services and the Student Clinic Card) online. Once you have completed the forms you will then have access to student's grades, attendance, and messaging teachers in FOCUS.

HAVE YOU MOVED?

Did you know that if the school sends you a letter it will NOT be forwarded to your new address? If you've recently moved, please do the following to change your address:


