Please DO NOT enter the student parking lot to drop off your child. Students who are dropped off in the student parking lot will receive a detention. If you want to avoid the car line in the morning, you may want to consider turning on to 7th Avenue from 28th Street and dropping students off along the sidewalk on 7th Avenue to cross Devil's Drive at the crosswalk by Portable 1. This will give the school the opportunity to look up the student's schedule and send for them to meet you in the front office. Parents, it is important that we check the driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school. This will be done to ensure the safety of your child. After 1:00 pm there will be no permission to leave slips written, due to the time constraints on using the proper method of getting your child from class.

MEDICATION GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOL

We encourage all medications to be given at home. However, if a medication is required during school hours, the following guidelines will apply:

- Policy & Procedure for medication administration at PCS:
 STUDENTS MAY NOT TRANSPORT MEDICATIONS TO OR FROM SCHOOL Medications cannot be given to bus assistants to transport to school.
- All parent/guardians must complete a medication form and/or obtain MD signature/order.
- If medications need to be cut, they must be cut prior to bringing them to school.
- Pill crushers, calibrated measuring spoons, soft food for mixing, and special drinks must be provided by a parent/guardian. Physicians order must also specify these directions.
- Parents are required to pick up and sign out any unused or unnecessary medication at the end of the school year or upon request. Be aware that all medications remaining at the end of the school year will be destroyed.
- Over the counter products, including but not limited to non-prescription medication, medicated lip balm, and cough drops, will require both parent signature and written health care provider prescription.
- All medications must be in their original pharmacy or unopened manufacturers container with the equipment necessary to be given (ex: spacer, tubing, mask, etc.)
- Over the counter (OTC) products or medications must have a health care provider order which includes:
 - ♦ Student name
 - Medication name
 - Specific dosage instructions and time
 Signature of MD and phone number
- Signature of MD and phone number
 Narcotics, barbiturates, non-FDA regulated non-prescription herbal products and essential oils/ aromatherapy products will not be given at school.
- New medication cards and authorization forms are required each school year.
- The following medications may be self-administered:

I have begun taking money for senior dues. If you are on campus, you can bring in exact cash or check made out to SPHS. ABSENCES

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call or written excuse (from the parent must be emailed to StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org.), is required to be sent within 48 hours of the absence. The email should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent telephone number. A parent may excuse 5 days in a semester. Further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.

Flu season began Sept. 27th! This year's flu season is going to overlay with COVID, as the symptoms of both mirror each other. Because of COVID-19, preventing the flu is more important than ever for a few reasons:

- Similar symptoms: Both the flu and COVID-19 share similar symptoms in kids - fever, chills, cough, sore throat, congestion, body aches and fatigue - which can make quickly diagnosing and treating someone more difficult. Getting both at the same time can also make it more difficult to recover.
- Symptoms that spread COVID-19: Some symptoms of the flu can actually help spread COVID-19 by releasing droplets, namely congestion and cough.
- **Preventing crowded hospitals:** Both the flu and COVID-19 found the flu vaccine reduces the risk of being admitted to an ICU with the flu by 82%.
- **Overall health:** Getting a flu vaccine contributes to overall health $\frac{2}{2}$ and the health of the community. It can also help shorten how long you have the illness and lead to less missed school and workdays.

COLLEGE VISITS FOR SENIORS

COLLEGE VISITS FOR SENIORS Do you plan on visiting a college? If so, you must stop by the need to have all your teachers and parent sign the form and return it to the Main Office three days prior to your visit. Make sure to read the directions on the TDF. You will product the directions on the TDE. You will need to bring back a letter on letterhead from the college you visited, stating the date you attended. The letter will need to be turned in to the Main Office within 2 days of your return. Your absence will then be corrected. College Visits do not count as an absence for exam exemptions.
