


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CERTIFICATIONS



MIDDLE SCHOOL PROMOTION POLICY

The basic course requirements are listed below for middle school student progression. Students must pass all twelve of these courses or higher level courses:

- Language Arts: Grades 6, 7, 8—Three middle grade or higher courses in language arts.
- Mathematics: Grades 6, 7, 8—Three middle grades or higher courses in mathematics.
- **Science:** Grades 6, 7, 8—Three middle grade or higher courses in science.
- **Social Studies:** Grades 6, 7, 8—Three middle grade or higher courses in social studies.

If a sixth or seventh grade student fails **more than** three (3) basic courses within an academic year, the student will be retained.

If a sixth or seventh grade student **fail 2 courses** within an academic year, the student will be in jeopardy of being retained and will need to complete Plato Course Recovery to recover the course failed.

If an eighth grade student fails **one of the 12 core courses** prior to completing the eighth grade year, the student will be retained in 8th grade without promotion to high school.
