

Eighth grade students need to be prepared for the academic rigor and expectations of turning in all work in a timely manner to succeed in high school. During the 4th Nine Weeks Grading Period, the 8th grade students will be learning the following content in U.S. History: "A DIVIDING NATION, 1848-1861," "THE CIVIL WAR, 1861-1865," and "THE RECONSTRUCTION ERA."

The last DBQ or "Document-Based Questions" Activity will be on The Civil War: "What Caused the Civil War?" during the Fourth Nine Weeks Grading Period. It is extremely beneficial for ALL students to learn how to analyze and make inferences from primary and secondary sources in U.S. History. ALL 8th grade students will be completing the DBQ on the Causes of the Civil War.

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SCIENCE

SCIENCE FAIR

All students enrolled in a gifted and talented science class are required to design and perform their own experiment and then create a slideshow presentation (grades 6 and 7) or a trifold board (8th grade). It is a time-consuming project that students are expected do almost entirely outside of the classroom. For those students who went above and beyond, they



were provided the opportunity to present their projects to professional scientists that work in Central Florida.

The following students were selected to represent Teague at the Seminole County Regional Science Fair this past February:

- Alexis Brasoveanu (6th grade)
- **Caesin McShane-Davis** (7th grade) --> received honorable mentions in Engineering
- Riley Begg (8th grade)
- Ashton Duguid-Petrakis (8th grade) --> received 1st place in Environmental Engineering
- Arpita Kumar (8th grade) --> received 2nd place in Behavioral Sciences

Ashton was nominated to represent Seminole County in the Lockheed Martin Science Fair held at the Orlando Science Center.

Both Ashton and Arpita were two out of 16 middle school students selected to represent Seminole County in the state science fair this April.

7TH GRADE

Seventh graders can look forward to studying the structure of DNA and the inheritance of genetic information, an introduction to optics (Physics In A Box: Year 2), and wrapping up the year with a brief, but highly informative unit on Health (a letter with detailed information will be sent home after Spring Break).

Students can look forward to a wide variety of labs, including the opportunity to explore genetic disorders, making a model of DNA out of candy, extracting DNA from strawberries, and gaining a better understand of lenses, which includes making a model telescope and microscope.

6TH GRADE

Sixth graders can look forward to learning about the unique characteristics for each of the eight planets in our solar system, the science behind seasons, tides, and eclipses, the effects of gravity, and an introduction in physics and mechanics.



The sixth-grade field trip to the science center will be on **Wednesday**, **April 5**. Students attending the field trip need to arrive on campus no later than 9:30 and are only allowed to bring small bag; school backpacks will not be allowed.

8TH GRADE

Eighth grade Science students will be focusing on homeostasis of the human body, frog dissection, vocabulary development and review for the upcoming Florida Statewide Science Assessment in May. Please continue to check student's science notebooks and encourage your student to maintain it regularly since our curriculum is online in eCampus. Regular attendance and homework completion will help your student to be most successful!

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




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
