Also, if you are pursuing the Gold Seal Scholarship you must have 3 consecutive classes within a certain CTE Pathway. For an explanation of this please see Mrs. Joyner in Rotary Futures or your guidance counselor. Search the Bright Futures Scholarship website to stay on top of the latest requirements for this state scholarship (www. MyFloridaEducation.com/brfuture).

\*\*Some courses do not meet Bright Futures requirements. Make sure courses you select will qualify for Bright Futures. Please note that Liberal Arts Math does not meet the requirements for Bright Futures. Algebra 1A and Algebra 1B counts as one math credit for universities and Bright Futures.

\*\*To our athletes\*\* NCAA has certain requirements for courses, gpa and test scores. NCAA <u>will not</u> accept APEX classes and certain academic classes. Please see your coach and/or counselor to make sure you have selected your academic classes correctly.

We encourage all students to READ, READ, READ over the summer. The English Department will provide a summer reading list. Please do all you can to use your summer as an academic enrichment time.

## STATE COLLEGE OF FLORIDA NOW TAKING APPLICATIONS

Seniors— Do NOT delay in applying to State College of Florida (SCF). Applications are currently being accepted. Students must pay a \$20 enrollment deposit, which will be credited to their first semester. Also, SCF scholarships are dependent on your admission and completion of the FAFSA. #### SENIORS MISSED OUT ON \$2 MILLION IN FEDERAL AID!

#### www.FAFSA.GOV

Last year, over \$2 million was unclaimed by eligible students in Sarasota County who did not complete the FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The information gathered on the FAFSA provides the federal and state government, as well as most postsecondary institutions, with the financial information needed to determine the amount of financial aid that a student is eligible to receive, i.e. Pell Grants, Federal Direct Student Loans, etc. It is very important to complete the FAFSA as soon as possible.

FAFSA IS EASIER! The FAFSA uses "prior prior year" income tax returns, so you will use your 2022 return (which was submitted last year)! You may also be able to link the FAFSA to the IRS and transfer your information with the easy IRS Data Retrieval Tool.

It's not too late to file! File online NOW at www.FAFSA.GOV Step by step instructions are on the VHS Website > Resources > Venice High Downloads > FAFSA Steps.

BEWARE—Only use the FAFSA.GOV website! Do NOT use FAFSA.com, FAFSA.net, etc.! These are NOT the federal government's websites!!! They will collect your personal information and then charge you a \$70 - \$ \$80 fee for the "free" application.

For help with the FAFSA, VHS seniors can visit Rotary Futures on Tuesdays through Fridays from 8:30am until 3:00pm or make an appointment with Mrs. Tippman in room 4-241. Rotary Futures College Resource Center is located across from the front office in the VHS Administration Building.

### SENIORS - Class of 2024

#### FLORIDA AID and BRIGHT FUTURES INFORMATION

ANY SENIOR who wants to be considered for State of Florida scholarships or grants (including Bright Futures) *MUST* complete an on-line application prior to graduation called the "Florida Financial Aid Application" (the FFAA.) <u>The application is ONLY FOR SENIORS.</u>

To complete the application, visit the Rotary Futures for assistance or go to the Bright Futures website: www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/

Under "First Time Applicants," click on "Create Student Account." This is only the first step! Once the account is created, the next screen will have a link at the top of the page for the student to COMPLETE the Florida Financial Aid Application. NOTE—students will receive TWO emails during this application process. One email arrives immediately after the student makes their Student Account and includes the student's user ID and initial password. The second email arrives after the application is submitted (within 1-3 days.) Save these email as they contain instructions on checking your status. The entire process will only take 5-10 minutes to complete.

  - Florida Academic Scholar (FAS) = 3.5+
  - Florida Medallion Scholar (FMS) = 3.0+
  - Gold Seal Vocational (GSV) = 3.0+
    - o AND 3.5 GPA in a CTE Pathway
- Minimum Test Scores:
  - FAS requires a minimum superscore 1340 SAT RW+Math only OR a 29 ACT composite score or a 96 on the CLT (Classic Learning Test)
  - FMS requires a minimum superscore 1210 SAT RW+Math only OR a 25 ACT composite score or an 84 on the CLT (Classic Learning Test)
  - For GSV
    - o SAT = 24 Reading, 25 Writing/Language, 24 Math
    - o ACT = 17 English, 19 Reading, 19 Math OR
    - o PERT = 106 Reading, 103 Writing, 114 Math
- Community Service Hours / Employment Hours:
  - FAS = 100 service hours (or 100 logged employment hours); FMS = 75 service hours (or 100 logged employment hours); GSV=30 service hours (or 100 logged employment hours)

## SENIORS— IMPROVE TEST SCORES FOR BRIGHT FUTURES! JUNIORS—TAKE YOUR SAT and ACT NOW!

Seniors—You may test through July of 2024 to qualify for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship program. Remember to always send your test scores to a state university so Bright Futures will have access to your score. You have 4 free score reports to send when you register for the test.

Juniors—Do not wait to take your first test until your senior year. Take your SAT and ACT before the end of your junior year. We suggest you take both the SAT and ACT to determine if you score better on one test than the other. Colleges will accept either test, and they will use the best score—no matter which test. Colleges will not even begin to review your application for admission until they have received your test scores and other required materials.

Optional Essay/Writing tests are NOT required by Florida colleges and universities, but they may be required by out-of-state colleges/universities. Check specific colleges for requirements. The following are the remaining test dates and registration deadlines (without late fees) for the SAT and ACT:

SAT May 4, 2024 Deadline – April 19th SAT June 1, 2024 Deadline – May 16th ACT June 8, 2024 Deadline – May 3rd ACT July 13, 2024 Deadline – June 7th CLT May 11, 2024 Deadline—April 30th

Test scores will be posted to your online account about 2-3 weeks after the test dates.

Waivers for test fees are available for students who receive free or reduced lunch. To obtain waivers, contact the Rotary Futures College Resource Center.

The Sarasota County School District has established procedural guidelines for student dress, inaccordance with School

Individual schools are expected to use the District dress code guidelines as minimum standards and are encouraged to extend their own standards to meet the uniqueness of their school community. Schools are encouraged to obtain input from school stakeholders, including School Advisory Councils, parents, staff, and students as they establish a school dress code policy.

The principal's decision on the appropriateness of dress will be final. Refusal to comply with theschool's dress code policy is an infraction under this code.

Students have a RIGHT to:

- Wear appropriate clothes or the school uniform, as long as those clothes or the way the clothes are worn are appropriate for the school setting, adhere to the school dress code, arenot dangerous to health or safety, and do not disrupt the learning environment.
- · Learn without a disruption to the school or classroom environment

Students have a RESPONSIBILITY to: Comply

- · with the school dress code.
- . Wear their current/valid student ID (visible at all times).
- · Be respectful of their peers at all times regardless of what they are wearing.
- · Come to school fully clothed and wear clothes which are not dangerous to health or safety, do not disrupt the learning process, and stay within the school dress code.
- Dress in a way not offensive to others at school or at school-sponsored events, including, butnot limited to:
- · At all times, no:
  - exposed undergarments

  - jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants worn below the hips
    jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants with rips above the mid-thigh
  - · excessively short skirts, shorts, or dresses that at any time expose underwear or bodyparts in an indecent or vulgar manner
  - pajamas or slippers
  - excessively low-cut tops
  - · see-through clothing (includes mesh material mid-thigh and above)clothing of an
  - ethnic or racially offensive nature
- Clothing must cover the mid-riff when standing naturally
  Sleeveless shirts must have straps with a minimum width of one inch (about two fingers) andthe gap below the armpit cannot be excessive of three inches (about four fingers)
- Not wear items or markings which are offensive, suggestive, indecent, or associated withgangs; as identified by the Florida Gang Intent Act of 1990.
- · Not wear items which encourage the use of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, weapons, or support discrimination on account of race, color, religion, ethnic or national origin, age, disability, veteran or military status, marital status, pregnancy, sex, gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, or any other characteristic protected by federal or state law or School Board policy.


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

# Guardian: How to Create an Account and Claim a Student




#### Students must "invite" their guardian to create an account in SchooLinks

To create a guardian account (or to claim additional students), you must have a claim code. Your student will need to provide you with their unique claim code (instructions below) for you to create and link your account.


#### Inviting your guardian to create an account in SchooLinks:

When logged into your student account (MySCS SchooLinks tile), click the **Gear icon** in the top right-hand corner, then click **Account Settings**.

From here you will see and click on the section called Your Guardians pictured below:



Click on the **View Guardian Instructions and Unique Claim Code**, this will show a window like the one below, with instructions to send to your guardian. Copy the information and share it with the guardian who you're trying to add to SchooLinks. See the example below:



Your guardian simply needs to enter the link into their browser and they'll be taken to a page where they can claim you as their student.
