### Important School Information

### Students attending Venice High School in person:

- On August 31st, per the School Board of Sarasota County Public Schools and order 2020-EO-06, Venice High School will be open and available for "brick and mortar education, five days a week" for all students who wish to attend.
- Our faculty will strive to provide high-quality, face-to-face educational experiences for all students while implementing responsible safety measures. This will involve implementing personal protective equipment and procedures as well as systemic disinfection and cleaning protocols.
  - ▶ Hand sanitizer stations will be available throughout the campus.
  - Students and staff will transition through academic buildings via distinct, separated traffic patterns.
  - Transparent desk shields will be utilized in each classroom.
  - Students are encouraged to bring their electronic devices as all core academic textbooks are available on-line.
  - Deep cleaning will take place each night which disinfects all surfaces.
  - All students riding the school bus will be required to wear face coverings
  - Students will be required to wear face coverings as they transition in the hallways due to the proximity of other students and staff.
  - Students will be separated in the cafeteria as best as possible and outdoor seating will be utilized for additional seating.
  - The current locker-room setup will not be used at the start of school for changing into physical education uniforms, how this process will work is still in development.
- In the event, a student becomes ill, temperatures of over 100.4 will need to be picked up by parents/guardians and stay home until they are fever-free for 72 hours without medication.

### Students attending Venice High School through a remote learning platform:

- We will provide remote learning with the same curriculum as in-person instruction with the ability for students to interact with their teachers daily. This mode of learning will be conducted remotely and through a digital platform, including an interactive live video with the teachers.
- Student attendance will be taken each class period.
- Students will be assigned a specific time to log into the remote platform to actively participate in the class lesson, discussion, and activities. This will be teacher-directed and will require students to participate through a remote digital platform (Microsoft Team, Zoom, or another video conference platform).
- Students, like in the traditional school setting, will be expected to complete assignments daily.
- Utilizing the platform, students will have the opportunity to interact with their peers and work on group projects.
- The same activities and instruction that take place in the classroom will occur through the remote platform, and the same expectation of student behavior and performance will be required.
- This will not be the same as the 4th quarter. Grades will follow the same structure and expectations as students are accustomed to at Venice High School.
- Students will have the opportunity to transition back to the in-person learning at the end of each quarter, as long as notice is given so that a proper schedule can be created for the returning student.

Since 2002, the Rotary Futures College Resource Center has assisted students with college and vocational school decision-making, SAT/ACT information, college/school applications, résumés, essays, scholarships, financial aid and much more. #### **Scholarships for Seniors**

Rotary Futures has a **Scholarship Database** for high school SENIORS ONLY. The database holds approximately 500 institutional and private scholarships totaling more than \$60 million in scholarship dollars. The beginning of Senior year is the best time to start using this database. **Résumés** 

Résumés and letters of recommendation are important tools for seniors as they apply to post-secondary schools--colleges, technical or vocational schools. These are also important when they apply for scholarships. Résumés help to organize your activities during your high school years. They can be sent with college applications and are a requirement of many scholarships. We have a sample résumé to help you get started.

### Recommendations

**SENIORS**—Recommendation letters ARE NOT REQUIRED by any of the Florida public universities except New College of Florida and Florida A & M. Private and out of state schools may have other requirements. Please be respectful when requesting letters of recommendation from teachers and counselors. These letters take a great deal of time to write, and you need to give teachers and counselors AT LEAST 2 weeks' notice to complete these important letters. Also, please only ask 2 teachers to provide a recommendation. Do not ask for several and compare to see which you like best! This would be very inconsiderate of the time each teacher takes with your request. Recommendation letters WILL be required for the

scholarship process. Scholarships may require different numbers of letters, so we recommend obtaining two from community members (job, church, community service) and two from academic sources (teacher, guidance counselor.) Many counselors and teachers require a résumé or completion of their own form before they will write your recommendation. For scholarship purposes, students may make copies of these letters. Do not wait until deadlines line up your recommendations now and give your teachers and community references plenty of time to write their letters.

#### **Community Service Hours**

Any student wishing to complete their volunteer hours for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship MUST complete the ONLINE Sarasota County School District registration process and have the plan approved. Once approved, the student may print out a log sheet for each organization/activity.

Complete registration instructions are available on the VHS website > Resources > Venice High Downloads > Community Service Hours Info. Also, students may go directly to www. SarasotaCountySchools.net, click on the "Parents & Students" menu at the top of the page, under "Other Resources" follow the link "High School Community Service."

Remember, volunteering helps students build their resume and obtain valuable experience for college essays and scholarship competitions, too.

Important community service information and requirements:

- Do NOT start the registration application until the student knows where they are going to volunteer. The registration application does NOT "save" and you will be "locked" out if you do not complete the application when you start.
- Each organization/activity must be approved before the student volunteers. Once approved the student will be able to print a unique log sheet at any time. Each organization will have its own log sheet. New organizations/activities may be added for approval at any time.
- Don't wait for an approval email (because sometimes the system has problems with different email servers). You may log in anytime to see if you have been approved. If you can print out a log sheet, you know you've been approved!
- Students MUST volunteer in the Sarasota County area.
- NO MORE THAN 8 HOURS may be earned each day (due to child labor laws).
- NON-PROFIT and CHURCH RULES: All volunteering must take place with a non-profit organization--exceptions include hospitals and assisted living facilities (enrichment/ entertainment activities only). Church Community Service must be outreach to the entire community—no religious

instruction or activities that take place during church services will count.

The community service Evaluation Form must be completed for every volunteer organization and must be turned in with the log sheets. The Evaluation form is located on the page where log sheets are printed.

### Florida Bright Futures Scholarship

### **Check your Bright Futures Scholarship Eligibility on the FloridaShines** website – www.FloridaShines.org

- 1. Click on "Go to College" and select "Pay for College"
- Scroll down to the "Bright Futures Scholarships" paragraph 2
- Click on "Check Now." 3.
- 4 Students will need their Florida Student Identifier Number, which is available from their Guidance Counselor, Rotary Futures, or the VHS registrar.

### Florida Bright Futures Scholarship requirements are online!

Check out their website frequently to stay updated - www. floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/

- SENIORS—TEST SCORE INCREASES have greatly reduced the number of students who receive Bright Futures. Check your eligibility status (at www.FloridaShines.org) as soon as possible.
- Meet with your guidance counselor to confirm your schedule and compliance with course requirements. It is your job to know and meet the requirements of the Bright Futures Scholarship Program before high school graduation. Go to the Florida Bright Futures
- Confirm with the school that all your personal information is correct. Failure to have correct information such as social security number, address, and date of birth can delay your Bright Futures application.
- ▶ Bright Futures only calculates GPA based on the core academic areas (check out www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/ for details).
- Bright Futures will calculate GPA using the highest grades in each area, i.e. 4 highest English grades, 4 highest math grades (Algebra 1 and above), 3 highest science (does not include Health Science), 3 highest social studies, 2 *highest* foreign language (in same language)
- Community Service hours are required for ALL levels of Bright Futures—100 hours to 30 hours depending on the scholarship. Check the website for more information.
- Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship will ONLY fund technical and vocational degrees and certificates. Three specific classes in a technical or vocational program are required, and your guidance counselor can help you to schedule the three correct classes. For more info. on the Gold Seal award, go to website.
- ONLY Seniors will complete the online application for Bright Futures and other forms of state financial aid. This application will open in October your Senior year. Please do not try to complete the application before your senior year as it may cause problems.

Remember, failure to meet ALL Bright Future requirements by graduation day, will forfeit all future eligibility for a Bright Futures Scholarship.

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### VHS 2020-2021 School Dress Code Guide

This information is designed to address common questions and misconceptions about the dress code at Venice High School.

Administrators, teachers, and students worked together to establish a dress code that strikes a balance of what is considered reasonable and appropriate for a school setting.

We appreciate your support of the dress expectations that have been established and hope that this handout is helpful.

### **Student Dress Code**

Please adhere to the following expectations during school hours and school-sponsored events:

- No short shorts (all shorts must be a MINIMUM of mid-thigh in length)
- ripped or shredded pants, above midthigh, may not reveal skin
- no saggy / baggy pants
- leggings and yoga pants are permitted if skin and undergarments are not visible
- no pajamas or slippers
- no clothing of an ethnic or racially offensive nature
- no tube / bando or see-through tops

### PANTS, LEGGINGS, and EXPOSED UNDERGARMENTS

- Jeans with holes, shreds, and rips at mid-thigh or lower will be permitted.
- Shreds or rips above mid-thigh may NOT reveal skin.
- Pants must stay up without using a belt for assistance.
- Leggings and yoga pants are permitted if skin and undergarments are not revealing. **SHIRTS and TOPS**
- Strapless tops, backless tops, midriffs, and low-cut necklines are prohibited.
- Strapless and sleeveless tops may be worn with a cardigan or sweater that fully covers all areas appropriately.
- Shoulder straps must have a minimum width of a dollar bill.
- Undergarments must NOT display alcohol, drug, or sexual references.

### HOODS

Hoods are NOT to be worn in the building.

### SKIRTS, DRESSES, and SHORTS

Skirts, dresses, and shorts must be mid-thigh or lower, including athletic shorts.

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

The program does not require school staff to collect the insurance premiums. Online enrollment is highly recommended, as it provides the capability of printing an ID card as proof of coverage. This is especially helpful for student athletes who need to show proof of coverage before being permitted to participate in any athletic program. If the parent is not able to enroll online, all enrollment forms and premiums are mailed directly to the servicing agent by the parents. Please be sure to read all the enrollment materials you receive, in order to familiarize yourself with the program.

Please remember that injuries to students participating in interscholastic football are not covered under the regular Student Accident Insurance Policy. These student athletes should elect to be covered under the appropriate special policy. If students participating in interscholastic sports do not enroll in one of the Student Accident Insurance plans, they must provide a signed statement from their parents/guardians certifying that the student is covered under a major medical plan and they wish to waive the district offered plan.

The Accident Insurance Plans mentioned above do not cover any medical expenses due to an illness, nickness or disease. However, if your child is enrolled in Option 3, the In-Hospital Sickness Benefit Plan, the policy will pay up to \$500 for each day your child is hospitalized overnight as an in-patient due to a covered illness, sickness or disease up to a policy maximum of \$5,000 for up to a 12 month period of coverage. No other sickness benefits are payable for any outpatient expenses of doctor's services. The one-time cost to add the In-Hospital Sickness Benefit Option is \$40.00 for coverage starting from the date this application is received by the insurance company and continuing through the summer months until August, 2021.



COVERACE EFFECTIVE AND TERMINATION DATES: Coverage becomes effective on the first day of school or practice, or at 11:59 P.M. according to the U.S. Postal postmark date on enrollment envelopes or the date payment is received in School Insurance of Florida's office, whichever is the later date. The 24 Hour Basic Accident Plan coverage terminates at 12:01 A.M. on the last of summer, August 20:11. The At School Basic Accident Plan Coverage terminates at 11:59 P.M. on the last day of school, May, 20:17. The In-Hospital School Basic Accident Plan coverage terminates 12:01 A.M. on the last day of summer, August 20:11. Enroll online and coverage will become effective at 11:59 pm, that day, and you will receive an ID card immediately.
