Out of Field Assignments (November 2021)

The Florida State Department of Education requires that school districts notify parents/ guardians when their children are being instructed by a teacher who is "out-of-field." "Out-of-field" is a term used for teachers who are assigned teaching duties in a class dealing with a subject matter that is outside the field in which the teacher is certified.

The following teachers are teaching ourof-field in certain subject for 2021-2022 school year:

- Jeffrey Johnston ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages)
- Courtney Singh ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages)

It is important to note that the district requires "out-of-field" teachers to actively pursue certification requirements.



Guidance Corner

Seniors are finishing their college applications and waiting for acceptance letters. Please make sure that you are visiting the Rotary Futures College Resource Center to receive expert help on your college applications and scholarship applications. Please speak with your counselor or one of the counselors in Rotary Futures to help with post-secondary planning. We have information on STC, vocational schools, colleges, universities and the military.

If your student has not passed the FSA ELA or one of the EOC tests, we encourage you to see your counselor to find out about websites that offer test preparation. The fall FSA ELA scores should be available prior to the winter break. Students may use an acceptable ACT or SAT concordant

score to meet graduation requirements. Please see your counselor if you have not passed the FSA ELA, yet.

VHS continues to be a testing site for the ACT and SAT. Students can register online or obtain a registration form in the guidance department. Students that are planning to attend a 4-year university will need either an ACT or SAT score for admission. Please see your guidance counselor if you need assistance with registering for a test.

Please know that the SUS (State University System of Florida) does not count ALG 1A and ALG 1B as 2 separate math credits for university acceptance. The SUS will count this combination as 1 math credit.

Athletes---stay aware of your NCAA status. If you need assistance, please speak with your coach or guidance counselor. Please remember that the approved course listing has changed, so make sure that your courses comply with the requirements of NCAA. Liberal Arts Math does not count as a NCAA math and ALG 1A and ALG 1B are only .5 credits with NCAA.

Students that will be taking DE classes need to see their guidance counselor asap in order to make sure that they have all the necessary paperwork and test scores in place for their spring courses. The final deadline for enrolling in spring classes at SCF is December 1, 2021. Remember that some History and Science classes at SCF only count as .5 high school credit.

The graduating class of 2022 will need to make sure that they have met the 26 credit



requirement and have passed the FSA ELA, passed the Algebra 1 EOC and have taken the Geometry, Biology, and US History EOC. The 2022 graduates will also need to have an online course and at least a 2.0 gpa.

CLASS of 2022 BRIGHT FUTURES & STATE AID INFORMATION

ANY SENIOR who wants to be considered for one of the many State of Florida grants INCLUDING the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship, MUST complete the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) prior to graduation (not to be confused with the Federal Aid Application—FAFSA).

ONLY SENIORS MAY COMPLETE THE APPLICATION, which opens in October of senior year.

We prefer seniors complete the 10-minute FFAA application in Rotary Futures where we will have staff available for assistance. The application is simple and only takes 10 minutes to complete (no financial questions). Once your application is submitted, corrections can be VERY difficult, and you may have to make the corrections directly with the State of Florida – Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA.)

To complete the ONLINE application at home:

- 1. Go to FloridaStudentFinancialAidSG.org
- 2. Under First Time Applicants, click on "Create Student Account."
- 3. After creating the account and submitting, click on the link to complete the FFAA (Florida Financial Aid Application.) This step is VERY important.
- 4. Students should receive 2 emails from OSFA within the next 2-3 days. The first email will indicate the Student Account was created. The second email will indicate the application was submitted.
- 5. Follow the steps in the email to access the account and reset the password.

SENIORS—START YOUR SCHOLARSHIP SEARCH NOW!

The Rotary Futures College Resource Center offers a scholarship database that houses approximately 300 scholarships—local, state, national and institutional. The database is very user-friendly and is available to any Sarasota County high school Senior. Seniors should be accessing this scholarship program NOW! Most scholarships have February and March deadlines, and these deadlines will pass quickly after the first of the year. Rotary Futures is open Tuesday–Friday, 7:15 am – 3:30 pm and is closed on Mondays and school holidays.

We encourage parents and students from other schools to call before visiting to avoid unexpected closures due to presentations, meetings, illness, etc.

Any student wishing to complete their volunteer hours for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship MUST complete the ONLINE Sarasota County School District registration process and have the plan approved. Students register online at www. SarasotaCountySchools.net, click on the "Parents & Student" menu at the top of the page, under "Other Resources" follow the link "High School Community Service."

Remember, community service is an excellent way for students to build their resume and obtain valuable experience for college essays and scholarship competitions. **Important and requirements:**

- Each organization/activity should be approved before the student volunteers. Once approved the student will be able to print a unique log sheet for the organization/activity. New organizations/activities may be added for approval at any time!
- Approval only takes 2 3 days and sometimes sooner. Don't wait for an approval email (because sometimes the system has problems sending emails). You may log in anytime to see if you have been approved. If you can print out a log sheet, you know you've been approved.
- Students MUST volunteer in the Sarasota County area.
- NO MORE THAN 8 HOURS may be earned each day (due to child labor laws).
- NON-PROFIT and CHURCH RULES: All volunteering must take place with a non-profit organization (unless it's an internship—see point below). Exceptions include hospitals and assisted living facilities Church Community Service must be outreach to the entire community—no religious instruction or activities that are part of being a member of the church will count, i.e. no activities during church services.
- INTERNSHIP: Students may now earn community service hours for helping

out at a local business (which MUST be in Sarasota County). Students cannot use their Internship class hours for community service, and their time spent at the local business must be unpaid.

• When you turn in your log sheets, you must complete the Community Plan Evaluation form. This is available on the page where you print out the log sheets.

SAT PREP CLASS

There will be an after-school SAT prep class for VHS students only. The class provides students with <u>12 hours</u> of test-taking strategies applicable to the ACT, too.

- The classes will be held at VHS on Tuesdays—Feb. 1th, 8th, 15th and March 1st from 3:30pm-6:00pm. All classes are taught by Ms. Wendy Dunn. Class fills quickly and is limited to 25 students.
- The fee for the course is \$100, PLUS the cost of the book. Students are registered first come, first served upon receipt of the course fee.
- Students should visit Rotary Futures for more information.
- <u>Students who receive Free or Reduced</u> <u>lunch</u> may take the class for only \$50 (includes the book). Proof of free and reduced lunch will be required (copy of letter from school nutrition office.) If the student attends all classes, the \$50 will be refunded!

Check websites for up-to-date information. SAT and ACT writing/essay is Optional. NO Florida college or university requires the optional writing/essay, nor does the Bright Futures Scholarship Program.

***Waivers for test fees are available for juniors and seniors who are receive Free or Reduced Lunch. Go to Rotary Futures to get the waivers.

JUNIORS—DO NOT WAIT until your senior year to take your first test! Take one SAT and one ACT before the end of your junior year. We suggest you take both the SAT and ACT once you have completed Algebra 2 (or are about to complete Algebra 2). Some students do much better on one test than the other, so take both to see on which you do the best. You may take each test multiple times, too! All Florida public universities and most colleges and schools will accept EITHER test, and they will superscore using the best combination of scores from all tests taken.


FAFSA stands for FREE Application for Federal Student Aid. The FAFSA is the Federal Financial Aid Application. The information gathered on the FAFSA provides the federal and state government, as well as most postsecondary institutions, with the financial information needed to determine the amount of financial aid that a student is eligible to receive. Since this aid is based on need, it is very important to gather financial information from the family to make proper determinations. Therefore, the FAFSA should be filed as soon after October 1st as possible. Many colleges have priority FAFSA priority completion deadlines of December 1st or January 1st. File the FAFSA online at www.FAFSA.gov Beware of SCAM websites. Always use the website that ends in .GOV (dot GOV)! Remember-the FAFSA is always FREE. Need help? 
