In May, we will be administering a variety of Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate exams. Clearly, our students live in a world of "high stakes" testing.

Throughout the month of February, underclassmen will meet with their respective school counselors to select their academic courses for the upcoming school year. You will be pleased to know that Venice High School offers a wide range of academic offerings to meet all our students' needs and interests. These include the latest in accelerated course and program offerings such as our International Baccalaureate Diploma and Career Programmes, Advanced Placement Capstone Diploma Program, and Dual Enrollment courses. Programs like these allow our students to earn college

credits while attending high school and possibly earn Bright Futures Scholarships. We also offer a variety of Career and Technical Education programs that lead to industry certification. I encourage you and your child to consult with our guidance counselors regarding course selections that best align with your child's college and career aspirations.

I must remind everyone of some school policies that we all need to be aware of and comply with. Attendance, tardiness, and dress code are key areas where parents and guardians can help. To ensure a high-level of student success for all our students, I encourage parents and guardians to visit the Parent Portal to check on their student's attendance, grades, and academic progress in their classes There will be additional information available throughout the school year. Scholarship Deadlines Are Passing!

SENIORS—Scholarship deadlines are passing daily. Almost all scholarships will be due BEFORE APRIL 1st! Visit the Rotary Futures College Resource Center NOW to start the scholarship search and application process. (This is a process for Seniors ONLY.)

Get organized. Most scholarships will need the following:

- 1. Three (3) letters of recommendation (2 academic and 1 community)
- 2. Copy of transcript fill out Transcript Request in Rotary Futures
- 3. Résumé of school and community involvement, activities and awards.
- 4. Completed FAFSA (www.FAFSA.gov)
- 5. Scholarship applications will outline exactly what is needed.

Last year, over \$2 million was unclaimed by eligible students in Sarasota County who did not complete the FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The information gathered on the FAFSA provides the federal and state government, as well as most postsecondary institutions, with the financial information needed to determine the amount of financial aid that a student is eligible to receive, i.e. Pell Grants, Federal Direct Student Loans, etc. It is very important to complete the FAFSA as soon as possible.

FAFSA IS EASIER! The FAFSA uses "prior prior year" income tax returns, so you will use your 2018 return (which was submitted in April of last year)! You may also be able to link the FAFSA to the IRS and transfer your information.

It's not too late to file! File online NOW at www.FAFSA.GOV Step by step instructions are on the VHS Website > Resources > Venice High Downloads > FAFSA Steps.

BEWARE—Only use the FAFSA.GOV website! Do NOT use FAFSA.com, FAFSA.net, etc.! These are NOT the federal government's websites!!! They will collect your personal information and then charge you a \$70 - \$ \$80 fee for the "free" application.

SCF Now Taking Applications!

Seniors—Do NOT delay in applying to State College of Florida (SCF). Applications are currently being accepted. Students must pay a \$20 enrollment deposit, which will be credited to their first semester. Also, SCF scholarships are dependent on your admission and completion of the FAFSA. Apply today at www.SCF.edu

FLORIDA AID and BRIGHT FUTURES INFORMATION

ANY SENIOR who wants to be considered for State of Florida scholarships or grants (including **Bright Futures**) MUST complete an on-line application prior to graduation. The application is ONLY FOR SENIORS. To complete the application, visit the Rotary Futures for assistance or go to the Bright Futures website: www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/.

Under "First Time Applicants," click on "Create Student Account." This is only the first step! Once the account is created, the next screen will have a link at the top of the page for the student to COMPLETE the Florida Financial Aid Application. NOTE—students will receive TWO emails during this application process. One email arrives immediately after the student makes their Student Account. The second email arrives after the application is submitted (within 1-3 days.) Save these email as they contain instructions on checking your status. The entire process will only take 10-15 minutes to complete.

Any student wishing to complete their volunteer hours for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship MUST complete the ONLINE Sarasota County School District registration process and have the plan approved. Students register online at www.SarasotaCountySchools.net, click on the "Parents & Student" menu at the top of the page, under "Other Resources" follow the link "High School Community Service."

Remember, community service is an excellent way for students to build their resume and obtain valuable experience for college essays and scholarship competitions.

Important information and requirements:

- Do NOT start the registration application until the student knows where they are going to volunteer. The registration application does NOT save and you will be "locked" out if you do not complete the application when you start.
- Each organization/activity must be approved before the student volunteers.
 Once approved the student will be able to print a unique log sheet at any time. New organizations/activities may be added for approval at any time!
- Don't wait for an approval email (because sometimes the system has
 problems sending emails). You may log in anytime to see if you have been
 approved. If you can print out a log sheet, you know you've been approved!
- Students MUST volunteer in the Sarasota County area.
- NO MORE THAN 8 HOURS may be earned each day (due to child labor laws).
- NON-PROFIT and CHURCH RULES: All volunteering must take
 place with a non-profit organization--exceptions include hospitals
 and assisted living facilities (enrichment activities only). Church
 Community Service must be outreach to the entire community—no
 religious instruction or activities that are part of being a member of
 the church will count, i.e. no activities during church services.
- Hold on to your log sheets! Log sheets are turned in when at least 75 hours have been accumulated.

JUNIORS—TAKE YOUR SAT and ACT NOW!

SENIOR—IMPROVE TEST SCORES FOR BRIGHT FUTURES!

Seniors—You may test through June 2020 to qualify for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship program.

Juniors—Do not wait to take your first test until your senior year. Take your SAT and ACT before the end of your junior year. We suggest you take both the SAT and ACT to determine if you score better on one

test than the other. Since you may take these tests multiple times, you will be able to focus on the test you score best. Colleges will accept either test, and they will use the best score—no matter which test. Colleges will not even begin to review your application for admission until they have received your test scores and other required materials.

- ACT: www.actstudent.org \$52.00 + \$16.00 optional writing

Optional Essay/Writing tests are not required by Florida colleges and universities, but they may be required by other colleges/universities. Check specific colleges for requirements. The following are the remaining test dates and registration deadlines (without late fees) for the SAT and ACT:

ACT	April 4, 2020	Late fee will apply
SAT	May 2, 2020	Deadline – April 3rd

Test scores will be posted to your online account about 2-3 weeks after the test dates.

- 3. Under "Popular Parent & Student Links", select "Family Access Portal: Assignments-Attendance-Grades-Schedule".
- 4. On the left-hand side under the blue Sign-in button select "New User Registration."
- 5. Read the terms and conditions and select "I Accept".
- 6. Follow the directions as indicated.
- 7. Select "Save" to complete the parent or student account creation process.
- 8. Parent <u>and</u> student need to have separate accounts (Have your student create an email all tothemselves!)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

- Select NO to the question Are you a student? if you are a parent.
- Select Yes if you are a student.
- User Name: This name will be the parent or students user name to access info. It can be any combination of both letters and numbers. YOUR CHOICE!
- Enter a password for the parent or student user name. Again, YOUR CHOICE, but it is case sensitive.
- Parent or Student, enter <u>YOUR</u> email address that should be used by this system to confirm this account's security. Please note this is the email address that will be receiving emails from the teacher(s). If at any time your email changes, you must go back into Portal and update your account.
- When entering your child's Student ID number ("N number") <u>DO NOT</u> enter the letter "N". Only use the numeric values.
- A parent access confirmation number will be emailed to the email address you
 provided. You will need this information to login and complete the registration
 process. Failure to do this step will result in you NOT receiving emails from the
 system/teacher(s).

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VHS Dress Code Guide 2019-2020 School Year

HOODS

Hoods are NOT to be worn in the building.

SKIRTS, DRESSES, and SHORTS

Skirts, dresses, and shorts must be mid-thigh or lower, including athletic shorts.

APPROPRIATE

SHIRTS AND TOPS

- Strapless tops, backless tops, midriffs, and low-cut necklines are prohibited.
- Strapless and sleeveless tops may be worn with a cardigan or sweater that fully covers all areas appropriately.
- Shoulder straps must have a minimum width of a dollar bill
- Undergarments must NOT display alcohol, drug, or sexual references.



PANTS, LEGGINGS, and EXPOSED **UNDERGARMENTS**

- · Jeans with holes, shreds, and rips at midthigh or lower will be permitted.
- Shreds or rips above mid-thigh may NOT reveal skin.
- Pants must stay up without using a belt for assistance
- · Leggings and yoga pants are permitted if skin and undergarments are not revealing.



This article is designed to address common questions and misconceptions about the dress code at Venice High School.

Administrators, teachers, and students worked together to establish a dress code that strikes a balance of what is considered reasonable and appropriate for a school setting.

We appreciate your support of the dress expectations that have been established and hope that this handout is helpful.

STUDENT DRESS CODE:

Please adhere to the following expectations during school hours and school-sponsored events:

- no short shorts (all shorts must be a MINIMUM no spaghetti straps or exposed bra strap of mid-thigh in length)
- ripped or shredded pants, above mid-thigh, may not reveal skin
- no saggy / baggy pants
- · leggings and yoga pants are permitted if skin and undergarments are not visible
- no pajamas or slippers
- no clothing of an ethnic or racially offensive nature
- no tube / bando or see-through tops

- no low cut shirts with exposed cleavage
- shirts with straps must be at least the width of a dollar bill
- clothing that does not encourage the use of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, or weapons, or support discrimination on the basis of color, disability, national origin, marital status, race, religion, gender or sexual orientation

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


