Registration for the 2023-2024 school year will be starting soon. Students will be meeting with their counselors to discuss 4 year plans, Bright Futures requirements, course progression plans, etc.

If you are a current sophomore and you are interested in becoming an IB DP or IB CP student your junior year, then please see Mrs. Bartlett in the 3rd floor Admin Suite.

Please remember that your report card GPA is not the same as your Bright Futures GPA. Current sophomores and juniors—there are new NCAA requirements for your classes.

Please see your counselor or coach for the new requirements.

Seniors—make sure your transcript is correct and that you have the classes you need for graduation.

The graduating class of 2023 will need to make sure that they have met the 26 credit requirement and have passed the FSA ELA, passed the Algebra 1 EOC and have taken the Geometry, Biology, and US History EOC. The 2023 graduates will also need to have an online course and at least a 2.0 gpa.

 jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants with the inseam or out-seam shorter than themid-thigh
- pajamas or slippers
- see-through clothing (includes mesh material mid-thigh and above) clothing of an ethnic or racially offensive nature

- Clothing must cover the mid-riff when standing naturally
 Sleeveless shirts must have straps with a minimum width of one inch (about two fingers) and the gap
 below the armpit cannot be excessive of three inches (about four fingers) Not wear items or markings which are offensive, suggestive, indecent, or associated withgangs; as identified by the Florida Gang
- Not wear items which encourage the use of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, weapons, orsup discrimination on account of race, color, religion, ethnic or national origin, age, disability, veteran or military status, marital status, pregnancy, sex, gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, or any other characteristic protected by federalor state law or School Board policy

Under "First Time Applicants," click on "Create Student Account." This is only the first step! Once the account is created, the next screen will have a link at the top of the page for the student to COMPLETE the Florida Financial Aid Application. NOTE—students will receive TWO emails during this application process. Save these email as they contain instructions on checking your status. The entire process will only take 5-10 minutes to complete.

SENIORS MISSED OUT ON \$2.4 MILLION IN FEDERAL AID! www.FAFSA.GOV

Last year, over \$2.4 million was unclaimed by eligible students in Sarasota County who did not complete the FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The information gathered on the FAFSA provides the federal and state government, as well as most postsecondary institutions, with the financial information needed to determine the amount of financial aid that a student is eligible to receive, i.e. Pell Grants, Federal Direct Student Loans, etc. It is very important to complete the FAFSA as soon as possible.

FAFSA IS EASIER! The FAFSA uses "prior prior year" income tax returns, so you will use your 2021 return (which was submitted last year)! You may also be able to link the FAFSA to the IRS and transfer your information with the easy IRS Data Retrieval Tool.

It's not too late to file! File online NOW at www.FAFSA.GOV Step by step instructions are on the VHS Website > Resources > Venice High Downloads > FAFSA Steps.

BEWARE—Only use the FAFSA.GOV website! Do NOT use FAFSA.com, FAFSA.net, etc.! These are NOT the federal government's websites!!! They will collect your personal information and then charge you a \$70 - \$ \$80 fee for the "free" application.

SENIORS—IMPROVE TEST SCORES FOR BRIGHT FUTURES! JUNIORS—TAKE YOUR SAT and ACT NOW!

Seniors—You may test through June 2023 to qualify for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship program. Remember to always send your test scores to a state university so Bright Futures will have access to your score. You have 4 free score reports to send when you register for the test.

Juniors— Do not wait to take your first test until your senior year. Take your SAT and ACT before the end of your junior year. We suggest you take both the SAT and ACT to determine if you score better on one test than the other. Colleges will accept either test, and they will use the best score—no matter which test. Colleges will not even begin to review your application for admission until they have received your test scores and other required materials.

ACT Prep Course— Rotary Futures is sponsoring an ACT Prep Course at Venice High School that will be taught by Ali Tozer, owner of SPS Tutoring. Register at Rotary Futures for the four-course class from 6-8pm in the TEL LAB (4-262) on 3/27; 3/30; 4/3; and 4/5. The course tuition is \$175 and includes the ACT Prep Book. Students MUST register and pay in advance at Rotary Futures!

Optional Essay/Writing tests are NOT required by Florida colleges and universities, but they may be required by out-of-state colleges/universities. Check specific colleges for requirements. The following are the remaining test dates and registration deadlines (without late fees) for the SAT and ACT:





Are you interested in a career in health care including: Future Medical Doctors, Physical Therapists, Nurses, Occupational Therapists, Veterinarians, Radiology Techs, EMTs, Paramedics, Speech and Language Pathologist, Dentists, Biomedical Engineers, and more? The Venice High School Medical Academy is accepting applications for students entering 10th grade next school year.

Students who are accepted into the Medical Academy will take the following courses:

Health Science Anatomy and Physiology (10th grade) is an honors level and equally rigorous science course that takes students on an in-depth look at the human body systems. Students will

learn how the structures in each body system work to perform various functions to sustain life. Students will have the opportunity to perform lab skills such as taking measurements, making predictions and observations, and utilizing tools to perform dissection. Students must be accepted into the Medical Academy through the application process to take this course. Scan the QR code to access the application.

Health Science Foundations (11th grade) is an <u>honors</u> level course that covers a broad range of healthcare-related topics including medical

terminology, ethics and legal responsibilities, professional level first aid/CPR, infection control, and vital signs. Prerequisite 80% or better in Health Science Anatomy and Physiology (or equivalent course).

EKG Technician (12th grade) is an <u>honors</u> level course that focuses on in-depth instruction of the cardiovascular system including training in the appropriate theories, instrumentation and pharmaceuticals used in by health care providers. Students in this course will take the **NHA EKG Technician Certification** exam. In addition to EKG technician content, other skills such as sterile technique and phlebotomy may be covered. Prerequisite 80% or better in Health Science Foundations (or equivalent course).

We also offer an elective course for incoming 9th graders called **Medical Skills and Services** which focuses on career exploration, medical terminology and basic health care skills including bystander CPR/AED and First Aid which will be built upon throughout the program. This course include vocabulary and reading and therefore it is suggested that students be reading at or above grade level. **We ask that students fill out the online Interest Survey which can be scanning the QR code.**
