New FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) Updates

www.FAFSA.gov

As of now, the new FAFSA is delayed in its processing. Please note that your results will not process until mid-March at this time.

Last year, over \$2.8 million was unclaimed by eligible students in Sarasota County who did not complete the FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The information gathered on the FAFSA provides the federal and state government, as well as most postsecondary institutions, with the financial information needed to determine the amount of financial aid that a student is eligible to receive, i.e. Pell Grants, Federal Direct Student Loans, etc. It is very important to complete the FAFSA as soon as possible.

FAFSA IS EASIER! The FAFSA uses "prior prior year" income tax returns, so you will use your 2022 return (which was submitted last year)! Now, your FAFSA will automatically link to the IRS to transfer your information.

Create an FSA ID First! Students need an FSA ID, along with ONE parent/guardian. The student and parent will need to use separate email addresses and phone numbers to create their account: https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch

Once students and parents create their FSA ID, they will need to wait 5-7 days before beginning to complete the FAFSA form.

Once the 5-7 days pass after creating the FSA ID, students should complete their section first and then invite the parent. The parent will then accept the invitation via their email and finish their section of the form. Then, the student and parent sign and submit...and await results!

For help with the FAFSA, VHS seniors should visit Rotary Futures College Resource Center located across from the front office in the VHS Administration Building OR Michele Tippman, our Career Advisor, located in room 4-241.

SCF Now Taking Applications!

Seniors- Do NOT delay in applying to State College of Florida (SCF). Applications are currently being accepted. Students must pay a \$20 enrollment deposit, which will be credited to their first semester. Also, SCF scholarships are dependent on your admission and completion of the FAFSA. Apply today at www.SCF.edu

SENIORS - Class of 2024 FLORIDA AID and BRIGHT FUTURES INFORMATION

ANY SENIOR who wants to be considered for State of Florida scholarships or grants (including Bright Futures) *MUST* complete an on-line application prior to graduation called the "Florida Financial Aid Application" (not the FAFSA.) <u>The application is ONLY FOR SENIORS.</u> Rotary Futures visited seniors in government and economics classes in the fall to have them apply. Please have your child visit us at Rotary Futures to confirm that their Bright Futures application is processing.

To complete the application, visit the Rotary Futures for assistance or go to the Bright Futures website: www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/

Under "First Time Applicants," click on "Create Student Account." This is only the first step! Once the account is created, the next screen will have a link at the top of the page for the student to COMPLETE the Florida Financial Aid Application. NOTE—students will receive TWO emails during this application process. Save these email as they contain instructions on checking your status. The entire process will only take 5-10 minutes to complete.

Please report ALL scholarships including College scholarships and private, local, state and national scholarships. Due to time constraints, only college scholarships you will be accepting will be included in Senior Scholarship Night. (Also, Bright Futures scholarships will not be recognized at Senior Awards Night because final determination is not made until July.)

SENIORS—IMPROVE TEST SCORES FOR BRIGHT FUTURES! JUNIORS—TAKE YOUR SAT and ACT NOW!

Seniors—You may test through July 2024 to qualify for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship program. Remember to always send your test scores to a state university so Bright Futures will have access to your score. You have 4 free score reports to send when you register for the test.

Juniors—Do not wait to take your first test until your senior year. Take your SAT and ACT before the end of your junior year. We suggest you take both the SAT and ACT to determine if you score better on one test than the other. Colleges will accept either test, and they will use the best score—no matter which test. Colleges will not even begin to review your application for admission until they have received your test scores and other required materials.

ACT Prep Course: Rotary Futures is sponsoring an ACT Prep Course at Venice High School that will be taught by Ali Tozer, owner of SPS Tutoring. Registration for this course begins on February 27. The four-course class will take place from 6-8pm in the TEL LAB (4-262) on 4/1; 4/4; 4/8; and 4/11. The course tuition is \$175 and includes the ACT Prep Book. Students MUST register and pay in advance at Rotary Futures! (cash, credit/debit card, or check made out to Rotary Futures).

SAT Prep Course: Rotary Futures is sponsoring an SAT Prep Course at Venice High School that will be taught by Ali Tozer, owner of SPS Tutoring. Registration for this course begins on March 26. The four-course class will take place from 6-8pm in the TEL LAB (4-262) on 4/23; 4/25; 4/30; and 5/2. The course tuition is \$175 and includes the SAT Prep Book. Students MUST register and pay in advance at Rotary Futures (cash, credit/debit card, or check made out to Rotary Futures).

Optional Essay/Writing tests are NOT required by Florida colleges and universities, but they may be required by out-of-state colleges/universities. Check specific colleges for requirements.

Schools are encouraged to obtain input from school stakeholders, including School Advisory Councils, parents, staff, and students as they establish a school dress code policy.

The principal's decision on the appropriateness of dress will be final. Refusal to comply with theschool's dress code policy is an infraction under this code.

Students have a RIGHT to:

- Wear appropriate clothes or the school uniform, as long as those clothes or the way the clothes are worn are appropriate for the school setting, adhere to the school dress code, arenot dangerous to health or safety, and do not disrupt the learning environment.
- · Learn without a disruption to the school or classroom environment

Students have a RESPONSIBILITY to: Comply

- · with the school dress code.
- . Wear their current/valid student ID (visible at all times).
- · Be respectful of their peers at all times regardless of what they are wearing.
- · Come to school fully clothed and wear clothes which are not dangerous to health or safety, do not disrupt the learning process, and stay within the school dress code.
- Dress in a way not offensive to others at school or at school-sponsored events, including, butnot limited to:
- · At all times, no:
 - exposed undergarments
 - jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants worn below the hips
 jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants with rips above the mid-thigh

 - excessively short skirts, shorts, or dresses that at any time expose underwear or bodyparts in an indecent or vulgar manner
 - pajamas or slippers
 - excessively low-cut tops
 - · see-through clothing (includes mesh material mid-thigh and above)clothing of an
 - ethnic or racially offensive nature
- Clothing must cover the mid-riff when standing naturally
 Sleeveless shirts must have straps with a minimum width of one inch (about two fingers) andthe gap below the armpit cannot be excessive of three inches (about four fingers)
- Not wear items or markings which are offensive, suggestive, indecent, or associated withgangs; as identified by the Florida Gang Intent Act of 1990.
- Not wear items which encourage the use of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, weapons, or support discrimination on account of race, color, religion, ethnic or national origin, age, disability, veteran or military status, marital status, pregnancy, sex, gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, or any other characteristic protected by federal or state law or School Board policy.

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






Students who are accepted into the Medical Academy will take the following courses:
