Venice High School continues to set high standards for all students. To ensure that our school's expectations are clearly communicated, we have scheduled several student orientation

programs. All grade 9 students are required to attend our freshman orientation program scheduled for August 1 in the Venice Performing Arts Center (VPAC). This year, we will have two sessions for freshmen due to the size of the incoming class. During each session, students will participate in various activities designed to get them acquainted with the campus while parents attend a presentation in the VPAC.

- Students with last names A-L will attend an orientation from 9 am to 10:30 am.
- Students with last names M-Z will attend from 11-12:30 pm.
- There will be an evening presentation for any freshman parents unable to attend earlier in the day on August 1 from 5:30-6:30 pm.
- There will be an additional orientation on August 7 beginning at 11:00 am in the VPAC for new families or those unable to attend the earlier sessions.

Returning students may pick up schedules, rent lockers and purchase parking permits in the Cafeteria at the following times:

- 12th grade students, July 30, 8 am -11 am
- 11th grade students, July 30, 12 pm -3 pm
- 10th grade students, July 31, 8 am – 11 am

Scholarships for Seniors

Rotary Futures has a **Scholarship Database** for Sarasota County high school SENIORS and current college students. The database holds approximately 500 institutional and private scholarships totaling more than \$60 million in scholarship dollars. The beginning of Senior year is the best time to start using this database.

Résumés

Résumés and letters of recommendation are important tools for seniors as they apply to post-secondary schools--colleges, technical or vocational schools. These are also important when they apply for scholarships. Résumés help to organize your activities during your high school years. They can be sent with college applications and are a requirement of many scholarships. We have a sample résumé to help you get started.

Recommendation Letters

SENIORS—Recommendation letters ARE NOT REQUIRED by any of the Florida public universities except New College of Florida and Florida A & M. Private and out of state schools may have other requirements. Please be respectful when requesting

letters of recommendation from teachers and counselors. These letters take a great deal of time to write, and you need to give teachers and counselors AT LEAST 2 weeks' notice to complete these important letters. Also, please only ask 2 teachers to provide a recommendation. Do not ask for several and compare to see which you like best! This would be very inconsiderate of the time each teacher takes with your request. Recommendation letters WILL be required for the scholarship process. Scholarships may require different numbers of letters, so we recommend obtaining two from community members (job, church, community service, extra-curricular activity) and two from academic sources (teacher or guidance counselor.) Many counselors and teachers require a résumé or completion of their own form before they will write your recommendation. For scholarship purposes, students may make copies of these letters. Do not wait until deadlines—line up your recommendations now and give your teachers and community references plenty of time to write their letters.

College Planning Meeting

A free College Planning Meeting will be held on November 12, 2019, 7:00 to 8:30 pm in the Venice Performing Arts Center. Thanks to the sponsorship of Ehrlich & Sallapudi Orthodontics and the Rotary Futures College Resource Center, this meeting is free and open to all VHS and area high school students and families.

The meeting features Ms. Jane Robbins. Ms. Robbins is a graduate of Cornell University and Harvard Law School, and she has been very active with the local Cornell Club's Admissions Committee. Her discussion, “Demystifying College Admissions

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and Financial Aid,” will address what colleges look for in applicants, what students should consider when evaluating colleges and preparing applications, and need vs. merit-based financial aid.

Community Service Hours

Any student wishing to complete their volunteer hours for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship MUST complete the ONLINE Sarasota County School District registration process and have the plan approved. Once approved, the student may print out a log sheet for EACH organization/activity.

Complete registration instructions are available on the VHS website under School Resources, “Community Service Hours Info.” Also, students may go directly to www.SarasotaCountySchools.net, click on the “Parents & Students” menu at the top of the page, under “Other Resources” follow the link “High School Community Service.”

Remember, volunteering helps students build their resume and obtain valuable experience for college essays and scholarship competitions, too.

Important community service information and requirements:

- Do NOT start the registration application until the student knows where they are going to volunteer. The registration application does NOT “save” and you will be “locked” out if you do not complete the application when you start.
- Each organization/activity must be approved before the student volunteers. Once approved the student will be able to print a unique log sheet for EACH organization/activity. New organizations/activities may be added for approval at any time.
- Approval (or denial) usually happens within 2-3 days. Don’t wait for an approval email because sometimes the school district system has problems with different email servers. You may log in anytime to see if you have been approved. If you can print out a log sheet, you know you’ve been approved!
- Students MUST volunteer in the Sarasota County area.
- NO MORE THAN 8 HOURS may be earned each day (due to child labor laws).
- NON-PROFIT and CHURCH RULES: All volunteering must take place with a non-profit organization--exceptions include hospitals and assisted living facilities (enrichment/entertainment activities only). Church Community Service must be outreach to the entire community—no religious instruction or activities that take place during church services will count.
- The community service Evaluation Form must be completed for every volunteer organization and must be turned in with the log sheets. The Evaluation form is located on the page where log sheets are printed.

SAT Prep Classes Offered

This semester, two after-school SAT prep classes will be offered for VHS students only. The classes provide students with 12 hours of test-taking strategies applicable to the ACT, too. The first class prepares students for the October 5th SAT and for the October 27th ACT, and the class will be held at VHS on Tuesdays—September 10th,

17th, and 24th, from 3:15-5:45 pm and Saturday, September 28th, 8 am-12:30 pm. If there is enough demand, the second class will be offered on Tuesdays in October leading up to the November 2nd SAT and December 8th ACT.

All classes are taught by Ms. Wendy Dunn. Classes fill quickly and are limited to 25 students each. The fee for the course is \$100, PLUS the cost of the book.

Students who receive Free or Reduced lunch may take the class for only \$50 (includes the book). Proof of free and reduced lunch will be required (copy of letter from school nutrition office.) If the student attends all classes, the \$50 will be refunded!

Check your Bright Futures Scholarship Eligibility on the FloridaShines website – www.FloridaShines.org

Beginning Sophomore year, students may check their Bright Futures scholarship status on the FloridaShines.org website. This website is ONLY update after each semester. Updating may take up to 2 months after the end of the semester to process.

- Go to FloridaShines.org
- Click on “Go to College” and select “Pay for College”
- Scroll down to the “Bright Futures Scholarships” paragraph
- Click on “Check Now.”
- *Students will need their Florida Student Identifier Number, which is available from their Guidance Counselor, Rotary Futures, or the VHS registrar.*

Florida Bright Futures Scholarship requirements are online! Check out their website frequently to stay updated - www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/

- ✓ **SENIORS—TEST SCORE INCREASES** have greatly reduced the number of students who receive Bright Futures. Check your eligibility status (at www.FloridaShines.org) as soon as possible or stop by Rotary Futures to review your status.
- ✓ Meet with your guidance counselor to confirm your schedule and compliance with course requirements. It is your job to know and meet the requirements of the Bright Futures Scholarship Program before high school graduation.

- ✓ Bright Futures only calculates GPA based on the core academic areas (check the website www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/ for details).
- ✓ Bright Futures will calculate GPA using the highest grades in each area, i.e. 4 English, 4 Math (Algebra 1 and higher), 3 Science (does not include Health Science), 3 Social Studies, 2 Foreign Language (in same language)
 - NOTE—Algebra 1A and 1B only count as 1 total credit for Bright Futures and State University admissions.
- ✓ **Community Service hours are required for ALL levels of Bright Futures**—100 hours to 30 hours depending on the scholarship. Check the website for more information.
- ✓ **Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship** will ONLY fund technical and vocational degrees and certificates. Three specific classes in one technical or vocational program are required, and your guidance counselor can help you to schedule the three **correct** classes. For more info. on the Gold Seal award, go to website.
- ✓ ONLY Seniors will complete the online application for Bright Futures and other forms of state financial aid. This application will open in October of your Senior year and may be completed in the Rotary Futures College Resource Center. Please do not try to complete the application before your senior year as it may cause problems.
- ✓ Remember, ALL Bright Future requirements must be met by graduation—GPA, test score, and community service hours. Exception—students may take the SAT or ACT through June of their graduation year.

College Representatives Visit Venice High School

Throughout the fall, college representatives will be visiting Venice High School to give students information on their college. This is an excellent opportunity for students to get information as well as make personal contacts with those who can assist with admissions and scholarships. We schedule representatives to visit with students in the Rotary Futures College Resource Center. Students should check the visit calendar in Rotary Futures and sign-up to have a reminder sent to them. Remember—students must have their teacher’s permission to miss class to visit with the college reps.

Welcome Back!! We hope that you all had a restful summer and are ready for a new year of success and learning. In order to help meet the needs of all of our students, Venice High School has a guidance department with counselors that are ready to support your student with a variety of programs.

****Seniors need to stay prepared.** Keep your senior calendar in a visible location so that you do not miss any of the important dates. Visit the Rotary Futures office in the administration building often. Make sure that all your required courses for graduation have been met. Remember that your Bright Futures GPA and your Venice High GPA are not the same. If you have questions about your Bright Futures status, please see your counselor. All courses do not qualify for Bright Futures, so make sure you are aware of the courses you need to take. ******

**** SCF Dual Enrollment students need to make sure that they have given their counselor a copy of their Fall 2019 schedule.** If you drop a SCF course, let your counselor know immediately. Be aware that ECONOMICS at SCF does NOT meet graduation requirements. Also, be aware that some SCF classes only count for .5 high school credit. If you have any questions, please speak with your counselor.

****PARENTS**** Venice High will offer several evening presentations throughout the year that are devoted to specific grade levels. We encourage you to attend these presentations so that you can learn more about graduation requirements, scholarships, financial aid and post-secondary planning. These dates will be posted on our calendar once school begins. We hope to see you there.

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Hello Parents of the Class of 2020

It is already time to start thinking about senior portraits for the class of 2020. All seniors must sit for a session with Prestige Portraits (senior portrait division of Lifetouch) to have their portrait in the yearbook. They will sit for a formal photo session. They will take the formal tux/black drape (both provided) for the yearbook, cap and gown, and do poses with up to two outfit changes. The cost of the session is \$20. You will be sent proofs and will be able to choose your yearbook pose, and then can order additional photos if you choose. These photo sessions are by appointment only.

Community and Business Partner Involvement

Volunteering

Level 1 is the starting point for all volunteering. You must be Level 1 approved before you can be Level 2 approved. With a Level 1 clearance, you must stay within eye and earshot of a school faculty member or teacher at all times.

New Volunteers:

1. **Sign up!** Sign up on the Community Involvement Portal at www.sarasotacountyschools.net/Page/2629. You will be able to do this from home or in the Venice High School lobby. Once you complete your application and background check through Verified Volunteers, OCI will notify you when you are approved.
2. **Reach out!** Once approved, you will be added to the schools approved volunteer list. If you are eager, reach out to schools so you can get started ASAP!

Past Volunteers:

1. You must re-register regardless of your prior involvement at VHS or another school.
2. Follow steps #1 and #2 from above

Level 2 Volunteers:

1. Get approved as a Level 1 Volunteer
2. Click on "Level 2 Volunteering" when registering to learn about next steps.

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VHS Dress Code Guide 2019-2020 School Year

HOODS

Hoods are NOT to be worn in the building.

SKIRTS, DRESSES, and SHORTS

Skirts, dresses, and shorts must be mid-thigh or lower, including athletic shorts.

SHIRTS AND TOPS

- Strapless tops, backless tops, midriffs, and low-cut necklines are prohibited.
- Strapless and sleeveless tops may be worn with a cardigan or sweater that fully covers all areas appropriately.
- Shoulder straps must have a minimum width of a dollar bill.
- Undergarments must NOT display alcohol, drug, or sexual references.

PANTS, LEGGINGS, and EXPOSED UNDERGARMENTS

- Jeans with holes, shreds, and rips at mid-thigh or lower will be permitted.
- Shreds or rips above mid-thigh may NOT reveal skin.
- Pants must stay up without using a belt for assistance.
- Leggings and yoga pants are permitted if skin and undergarments are not revealing.

This article is designed to address common questions and misconceptions about the dress code at Venice High School.

Administrators, teachers, and students worked together to establish a dress code that strikes a balance of what is considered reasonable and appropriate for a school setting.

We appreciate your support of the dress expectations that have been established and hope that this handout is helpful.

STUDENT DRESS CODE:

Please adhere to the following expectations during school hours and school-sponsored events:

- no short shorts (all shorts must be a MINIMUM of mid-thigh in length)
- ripped or shredded pants, above mid-thigh, may not reveal skin
- no saggy / baggy pants
- leggings and yoga pants are permitted if skin and undergarments are not visible
- no pajamas or slippers
- no clothing of an ethnic or racially offensive nature
- no tube / bando or see-through tops
- no spaghetti straps or exposed bra strap
- no low cut shirts with exposed cleavage
- shirts with straps must be at least the width of a dollar bill
- clothing that does not encourage the use of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, or weapons, or support discrimination on the basis of color, disability, national origin, marital status, race, religion, gender or sexual orientation

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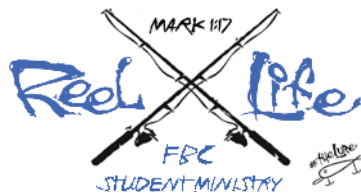
