What is the National Italian Exam and how do our VHS Italian students fare?

Established in 1985, the NIE is the official national language contest for middle and high school students of the American Association of Teachers of Italian. Currently, it is a web-based proficiency and performance assessment that measures written and aural interpretation skills in alignment with the ACTFL Performance Descriptors and the 2012 ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines. The mission of the NIE is to provide:

- an opportunity for the visibility and the promotion of Italian programs in North American schools;
- an assessment tool that can be used by teachers and students as a diagnostic feedback;
- a measurement of language skills that can constitute a positive washback to help inform high school instruction and curricula.

The NIE can be used to support students in preparation for the official exams of Seal of Biliteracy, the SAT II, and it can make them eligible for the Società Onoraria Italica scholarships.

In addition, the NIE provides an excellent opportunity to highlight our students' success as every

Résumés

Résumés and letters of recommendation are important tools for seniors as they apply to post- secondary schools--colleges, technical or vocational schools. These are also important when they apply for scholarships. Résumés help to organize your activities during your high school years. They can be sent with college applications and are a requirement of many scholarships. We have a sample résumé to help you get started—come visit us to get some help!

Letter of Recommendation

SENIORS (CLASS OF 2025)—

- Recommendation letters ARE NOT REQUIRED by any of the Florida public universities except New College of Florida and Florida A & M.
- Private and out of state schools may have other requirements.
- Please be respectful when requesting letters of recommendation from teachers and

counselors. These letters take a great deal of time to write, and you need to give teachers and counselors AT LEAST 2 weeks' notice to complete these important letters.

- Also, please only ask 2 teachers to provide a recommendation. Do not ask for several and compare to see which you like best!
 This would be very inconsiderate of the time each teacher takes with your request. Recommendation letters WILL be required for the scholarship process.
- Scholarships may require different numbers of letters, so we recommend obtaining two from community members (job, church, community service, coach) and two from academic sources (teacher, guidance counselor.)
- · Many counselors and teachers require a résumé or completion of their own form before they will write your recommendation.
- For scholarship purposes, students may make copies of these letters. Do not wait until deadlines—line up your recommendations now and give your teachers and community references plenty of time to write their letters.

Florida Bright Futures Scholarship requirements are online!

- Check your Bright Futures Scholarship Eligibility on the Family Access Portal! Once students begin eleventh grade, their Bright Futures report is available under the Transcript tab of the Family Access Portal!
- SENIORS—For the Florida Academic Scholarship that covers 100% of your tuition at a public Florida university, the SAT superscore required is a 1340 or a 29 on the ACT. For the Florida Medallion Scholarship that covers 75% of your tuition at a public Florida university, the SAT superscore required is a 1210 or a 25 on the ACT.
- Meet with your school counselor to confirm your schedule and compliance with graduation requirements. It is your job to know and meet the requirements of the Bright Futures Scholarship Program before high school graduation.
- Bright Futures eligibility requires two consecutive years of the same foreign language.
- Bright Futures only calculates GPA based on the core academic areas (check out www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/ for details).
- Bright Futures will calculate GPA using the highest grades in each area, i.e. 4 *highest* English grades, 4 *highest* math grades (Algebra 1 and above), 3 *highest* science (does not include Health Science), 3 *highest* social studies, 2 *highest* foreign language (in same language)
- Community Service hours OR Employment hours are required for ALL levels of Bright Futures—You may combine service hours with employment hours to a required minimum of 100 hours. Check the website for more information.
- Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship will ONLY fund technical and vocational degrees and certificates. Three specific classes in a technical or vocational program are required, and your guidance counselor can help you to schedule the three correct classes. For more info. on the Gold Seal award, go to website.
- ONLY Seniors will complete the online application for Bright Futures and other forms of state financial aid. This application will open in October your Senior year. Please do not try to complete the application before your senior year as it may cause problems.
- Remember, failure to meet ALL Bright Future requirements by August 31, 2026 (AFTER you graduate!) will forfeit all future eligibility for a Bright Futures Scholarship.



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

All of the SchooLinks features are designed with students in mind to help them become career, college, and life ready. As a guardian, you will have the opportunity to join your student in their career and college exploration process and have conversations with them about their future. You will have access to SchooLinks through your own account. SchooLinks is a tool that gives you access to the bigger picture of your students' future.

SchooLinks allows **you** to:

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Guardian: How to Create an Account and Claim a Student




Students must "invite" their guardian to create an account in SchooLinks

To create a guardian account (or to claim additional students), you must have a claim code. Your student will need to provide you with their unique claim code (instructions below) for you to create and link your account.


Inviting your guardian to create an account in SchooLinks:

When logged into your student account (MySCS SchooLinks tile), click the **Gear icon** in the top right-hand corner, then click **Account Settings**.

From here you will see and click on the section called Your Guardians pictured below:



Click on the **View Guardian Instructions and Unique Claim Code**, this will show a window like the one below, with instructions to send to your guardian. Copy the information and share it with the guardian who you're trying to add to SchooLinks. See the example below:



Your guardian simply needs to enter the link into their browser and they'll be taken to a page where they can claim you as their student.

As an alternative option, at the end of the link, there's a code. Your guardian could go to app.schoolinks.com/claim-student and follow the onscreen steps to enter the code there.





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
