### October 1st, 2022: Scholarship Season Kickoff! FAFSA Federal Aid Application Assistance

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) opens on October 1st. It is very important for Seniors seeking financial aid for their post-secondary education to complete the FAFSA as soon as possible after October 1st.

• On Tuesday, October 4th, we will be hosting a FAFSA Help Night for Senior Families in the Media Center. Stop by between 4:30pm and 7:30pm to receive assistance completing the FAFSA.

Rotary Futures can help Seniors start the FAFSA, and then student can go home to complete the application with their parent(s.) To get started, students must have a Social Security Number (SSN) to complete the FAFSA (but parents are not required to have an SSN.)

#### **Scholarship Database**

Rotary Futures has a scholarship database that students can only access in our resource center. After students complete the FAFSA, they can set up an account in our database. It contains roughly 250 scholarships and includes many local scholarship opportunities. It takes students about 15 minutes to create their profile. The database matches specific scholarship opportunities with each student. Kids leave with a printed Scholarship Worksheet that gives them pertinent information to apply for the specific scholarships for which they meet the criteria!

**Bright Futures Scholarship Requirements for the Class of 2023** 

Seniors MUST complete the Florida Financial Aid Application (not to be confused with the FAFSA) to receive Bright Futures. Only Seniors may complete the application, and we encourage Seniors to do so ASAP. The application must

be completed so the Senior is in the system to be evaluated. The first evaluation is done in January, and the FINAL evaluation for the scholarship is done in July 2023 after high school graduation. Students have until graduation to meet all requirements. Senior may take the SAT or ACT through June of their Senior year to qualify for Bright Futures.

**To complete the Florida Financial Aid Application** (Seniors Only,) go to:

floridastudentfinancialaidsg.org

Under First-Time Applicants, click on Create Student Account. This is only step 1 of the process. After submitting the student account, you must click on a link to finish completing the Florida Financial Aid Application. After submitting the student account, the student will receive an email with their log in and initial password. After submitting the Florida Financial Aid Application, the student will receive an email in 2-3 days with instructions for logging in and tracking their evaluations.

Bright Futures criteria are subject to legislative changes. Check the Bright Futures website for the most up-to-date information: www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf Here is the current Bright Futures test score and community service hours requirements:

## **Community Service Hours (Rotary Futures no longer coordinates Community Service)**

Any student wishing to complete their volunteer hours for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship MUST complete the ONLINE Sarasota County School District registration process and have the plan approved by the High School Community Service (HSCS) Manager. Mrs. Michele Tippman is the HSCS Manager for Venice High School. Once approved, the student may print out a unique log sheet for EACH organization/activity.

Complete registration instructions are available on the VHS website under Resources > Downloads > "Community Service Hours Info." Please review Page 2 of this flyer for "What Qualifies as Community Service." Page 3 and 4 give instructions for submitting the hours (bring to Mrs. Tippman in the media center).

Employment hours now count towards Bright Futures (from June 2022). Students must still request a log sheet and attach their pay stubs to the back of the log sheet. This will be turned in to Mrs. Tippman in the media center.


### Cell Phones and Electronic Devices

Students may possess an electronic device at schools. Tablets, smartphones, smart devices, laptops or other devices or technology that receive, send or store digital data are acceptable, provided that the students are using the devices for educational purposes, in conformance with School Board policies and procedures, and have permission from a staff member at the school. The School Board is not responsible for preventing theft, loss, damage, or vandalism to electronic devices or technology brought onto its property or vehicles or used during or for a school-related purpose. Refer to Sarasota County School Board Policy 5.38 for full district policy regarding student use of electronic devices.

By default, electronic devices (including earbuds) MUST be silenced and kept away when entering a class or office. Students are permitted to use their cell phone/electronic devices ONLY under teacher direction for instructional purposes, which will be indicated by a green "Electronic Devices Permitted" sign. If the sign indicates "Electronic Devices Must Be Silenced and Put Away," then all personal electronic devices should be kept silenced and put away in the student's bag or teacher's designated cell phone caddy. All electronic devices (including earbuds) must be left in class when using the restroom or when in the hallways during class time. Any student found with a cell phone in the hallway will be sent back to class.

Failure to adhere to electronic device expectations may include but are not limited to the following:

- 1st Offense: Warning and Parent Contact
- 2nd Offense: Lunch Detention and Parent Contact
- 3rd Offense: Administrative Referral and Confiscate Devices Until End of Day



When a student's compliance with the Venice High Dress Code is in question, they will be sent to the clinic. Consequences for violations may include, but are not limited to the following:

- 1st Offense: Change into appropriate clothing and call home
- 2nd Offense: Change into appropriate clothing and call home
- **3rd Offense:** Administrative referral with consequences, change into appropriate clothing and call home

(During FHSAA 2023 sanctioned Spring)

The program does not require school staff to collect the insurance premiums. Online enrollment is highly recommended, as it provides the capability of printing an ID card as proof of coverage. This is especially helpful for student athletes who need to show proof of coverage before being permitted to participate in any athletic program. If the parent is not able to enroll online, all enrollment forms and premiums are mailed directly to the servicing agent by the parents. Please be sure to read all the enrollment materials you receive, in order to familiarize yourself with the program.

Please remember that injuries to students participating in interscholastic football are not covered under the regular Student Accident Insurance Policy. These student athletes should elect to be covered under the appropriate special policy. If students participating in interscholastic sports do not enroll in one of the Student Accident Insurance plans, they must provide a signed statement from their parents/guardians certifying that the student is covered under a major medical plan and they wish to waive the district offered plan.



















