- 11th graders must pay to take the test. Please see Mr. Robertson (4-314) to register for the test. He can only accept checks and they should be made payable to VHS.

FSA-ELA and Algebra 1 EOC retakes for 11th and 12th graders will be September 11th-22nd.

Students are reminded to please check their transcripts to make sure they have all the classes needed to qualify for the Bright Futures scholarship.

**Seniors will be visiting with their counselors to ensure they have all credits needed for graduation. <u>Double check your transcript to make sure you have all credits necessary for graduation!!</u> Please remember the Class of 2024 graduation requirements are:

Bright Futures Scholarship Requirements for the Class of 2023

Seniors MUST complete the Florida Financial Aid Application (not to be confused with the FAFSA) to receive Bright Futures.

- Only Seniors may complete the application, and we encourage Seniors to do so ASAP
 after October 1, 2023. The application must be completed so the Senior is in the system
 to be evaluated.
- The first evaluation is done in January, and the FINAL evaluation for the scholarship is done in July 2023 after high school graduation. Students have until graduation to meet all requirements.
- Seniors may take the SAT or ACT through June of their Senior year to qualify for Bright Futures.
- To complete the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) (Seniors Only,) go to: floridastudentfinancialaidsg.org Under First-Time Applicants, click on Create Student Account. This is only step 1 of the process.

After submitting the student account, you must click on a link to finish completing the Florida Financial Aid Application. After submitting the student account, the student will receive an email with their log in and initial password. After submitting the Florida Financial Aid Application, the student will receive an email in 2-3 days with instructions for logging in and tracking their evaluations.



If you're looking for a sport which combines the teamwork and strategy of rugby and hockey as well as the toning benefits of swimming, then welcome to the world of water polo! Or if you're the swimmers wondering why should I try water polo. Then we have 10 benefits for playing water polo.

Water polo players come in all shapes and sizes, with different positions requiring different strengths. The sport also has a great social side, both in

The Sarasota County School District has established procedural guidelines for student dress, inaccordance with School

Individual schools are expected to use the District dress code guidelines as minimum standards and are encouraged to extend their own standards to meet the uniqueness of their school community. Schools are encouraged to obtain input from school stakeholders, including School Advisory Councils, parents, staff, and students as they establish a school dress code policy.

The principal's decision on the appropriateness of dress will be final. Refusal to comply with theschool's dress code policy is an infraction under this code.

Students have a RIGHT to:

- Wear appropriate clothes or the school uniform, as long as those clothes or the way the clothes are worn are appropriate for the school setting, adhere to the school dress code, arenot dangerous to health or safety, and do not disrupt the learning environment.
- · Learn without a disruption to the school or classroom environment

Students have a RESPONSIBILITY to: Comply

- · with the school dress code.
- . Wear their current/valid student ID (visible at all times).
- · Be respectful of their peers at all times regardless of what they are wearing.
- · Come to school fully clothed and wear clothes which are not dangerous to health or safety, do not disrupt the learning process, and stay within the school dress code.
- Dress in a way not offensive to others at school or at school-sponsored events, including, butnot limited to:
- · At all times, no:
 - exposed undergarments
 - jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants worn below the hips
 jeans, shorts, skirts, dresses or pants with rips above the mid-thigh
 - excessively short skirts, shorts, or dresses that at any time expose underwear or bodyparts in an indecent or vulgar manne
 - pajamas or slippers
 - excessively low-cut tops
 - · see-through clothing (includes mesh material mid-thigh and above)clothing of an
- ethnic or racially offensive nature
- Clothing must cover the mid-riff when standing naturally
 Sleeveless shirts must have straps with a minimum width of one inch (about two fingers) andthe gap below the armpit cannot be excessive of three inches (about four fingers)
- Not wear items or markings which are offensive, suggestive, indecent, or associated withgangs; as identified by the Florida Gang Intent Act of 1990.
- Not wear items which encourage the use of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, violence, weapons, or support discrimination on account of race, color, religion, ethnic or national origin, age, disability, veteran or military status, marital status, pregnancy, sex, gender, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, or any other characteristic protected by federal or state law or School Board policy.


When logged into your student account (MySCS → SchooLinks tile), click the Gear icon in the top right-hand corner, then click Account Settings.


From here you will see and click on the section called **Your Guardians** pictured below:


