Mid-Spring also means "testing season", and our students will be hard at work with numerous assessments including FAST (replaced FSA/ELA), Algebra, Geometry, Us History, and Biology EOC's

(End of Course Exams) all throughout April and May. We cannot stress enough how important these tests are for a student's outcome and standing in high school. EOC's in Algebra, Geometry, Biology, and US History count for 30% of a student's final grade for the course, and students must pass one of the math EOC's and the FSA/FAST to receive a high school diploma. All accountability measures for high school graduation are in place. You can find our full testing calendar on our school website along with newly published information on the FAST (adaptive test). Our spring sports teams are producing great competitive results, including a couple of possible runs for state titles, and our performing arts programs have been extremely busy with Solo/Ensemble, MPA's, and State level competitions.

The months of April and May will mark both an end and new beginnings for our Graduating Class of 2023. They will gather in celebration for Prom on Saturday April 22nd at the IG Center from 8-11PM. In order to attend Prom students must have 90% attendance by class periods, no more than 5 days of suspension for the SY, and all obligations cleared. VBHS Graduation Commencement Exercises 2023 will be on the morning of Saturday, May 20th at 8AM in the Citrus Bowl with gates opening at 6:30AM. There is no number limit for attendees and seating is general admission. Seniors are to report at 6:30AM to the FLC gymnasium that morning. Seniors only; last day of school is Friday May 12th with the week of May 15th reserved for Senior "catch-up" and graduation practices. They must return to attend their graduation practices on Tuesday May 16, Wednesday May 17, and Thursday May 18 from 8-9:30AM. Reporting to the FLC gym. The last day of school for all other students is Wednesday May 31st.

As always, it will be an extremely busy end to the school year 2022-23 as we celebrate and reflect on all the accomplishments our students have made in their academic careers thus far. Also, "Teacher and Staff Appreciation Week" for our district is the week of May 1st. I thank our teachers and staff for their continuous efforts and providing outstanding educational opportunities here at VBHS. THANK YOU! To our "graduating" parents, we especially thank you for your support over the past four years, and we certainly hope you will always feel at home here in the years to come.

## Attendance Matters!

Chronic unexcused absences will negatively affect a student's progress in high school, keep them from eligibility to participate in extracurricular activities, suspend privileges, and if fact the State of Florida may suspend their driver's license. In addition to all this, there is a new district wide attendance policy for secondary students (grades 6-12) who are "habitually truant" which is defined as; "10 unexcused absences in any one core course per semester". According to policy; for habitually truant students, the school attendance committee will meet at the end of each semester and may withhold credits for students who are habitually truant. Students are regularly reminded of this policy at school and encouraged to attend their classes, so that they do not lose credits towards graduation due to habitual truancy.

# 90% Attendance, Tardy Policies, and Procedures

VBHS has a 90% Attendance Policy, which means students must attend 90% of their classes in order to participate in sports, extracurricular activities, clubs and/or privileges (parking, dances, Grad Bash, Prom, etc.). Students may participate in practices, rehearsals, etc. but may not participate, compete, or perform in athletic games, performances, and extracurricular events until they are in compliance with the 90% Attendance Policy.

Please note that for a tardy to be excused, a parent/guardian must physically sign the student in at the attendance desk or the student needs to provide a medical or court note for the time missed. NO phone calls to excuse a tardy. If a student has been called out of class by attendance to be able to leave campus, the student must sign out at the attendance desk and receive a pass to leave campus for the absence to be excused. To have a student called to leave campus, you must be on the contact list in Focus. There is also no early release for students after 1:22pm.




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# **Dual Enrollment**

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

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# **Performing Arts Department**

The VBHS Performing Arts Department has had a busy 3rd nine weeks. Band, Chorus, and Orchestra all participated in Music Performance Assessments in February and March. The VBHS Indoor Color Guard received a superior rating at the FBA Auxiliary MPA. All VBHS Band students participated in the FBA Solo and Ensemble MPA in January. 77 superior medals were award to student musicians who performed solos or small ensembles and 9 Color Guard soloists received superior ratings. The VBHS Jazz Ensemble and Studio Jazz Band received superior ratings at the Florida Bandmasters Association (FBA) District Jazz Music Performance Assessment in February. In March, all three of our concert bands participated in the FBA Concert MPA. The Philharmonic Band and Symphonic Bands both received straight superior ratings. During Spring Break, several band students participated in the FBA State Solo and Ensemble MPA. Three ensembles received superior ratings and three soloists received superior ratings. The Indoor Guard and several soloists participated in the FBA State Auxiliary MPA. In addition to the Indoor Guard earning straight superiors, five guard soloists earned superiors. The VBHS Symphonic Band will be traveling to Sarasota in late April to participate in the FBA State Concert MPA.

The VBHS Chorus participated in their District MPA in March. The Women's Choir earned an overall superior rating. Voices of Vero earned a superior at District Solo and Ensemble and attended State Solo and Ensemble on April 1st. Our choirs will conclude their concert season with their Spring Concert called *River of Dreams* on May 2nd at 7:00 p.m. Tickets are available at the PAC Box Office.

All three of our orchestras participated in the Florida Orchestra Association District MPA in March. Philharmonic Orchestra earned straight superior ratings and qualified for state MPA. Their concert season concludes with the Symphony Orchestra Concert on May 10th at 7:00 p.m.

The week before spring break, the theatre troupe students went to Tampa at The Florida State Thespian Festival. They received a superior rating for their one act "Dark Road". Senior Kristina Gregg earned Top Honors and received a perfect score of Straight Superiors in the category of Solo Musical. Juniors Jessah Moore and Emily Barnett also received Top Honors for their Duet Musical with a perfect score of Straight Superiors. The Ensemble Scene from "Cheating Death", featuring Marcos Viloria, Rachel Estillore, Terrance Taylor, Christopher Spalding, Aubrey Dunham, Bronwyn Segal, Kalea Pfeiffer, and Katelyn Ragen received a superior rating.
