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#### **Top Ten Seniors**



#### **Performing Arts Department Happenings**

The VBHS Performing Arts Department began its busiest part of the school year in January. Three VBHS students participated in Florida All State ensembles in early January. The VBHS Band had 18 students participate in the Four County Honor Band and Jazz Band at IRSC in mid-January. Our Associate Director of Bands, Ms. Jessica Russell, was the clinician for the Four County Honors Jazz Ensemble. The Fighting Indians Band once again participated in the Martin Luther King Day Parade in Gifford. On January 24th, the VBHS Jazz Bands were fortunate to have a clinic with trumpeter Charles Lazurus from the Minnesota Symphony Orchestra.

On January 29th, 75 band musicians and 18 color guard members participated in the Florida Bandmasters Association District Solo and Ensemble/Color Guard Music Performance Assessment at St. Lucie West Centennial HS. Over 80 superior medals were awarded to musicians. Four guard members received superior medals for solos. The VBHS Indoor Color Guard earned a superior rating for their floor show. During January and February, the VBHS Jazz Bands have been preparing for a jazz concert and the FBA District Jazz Music Performance Assessment.

Both the VBHS Choir and the VBHS Orchestra have been preparing for their music performance assessments that will be happening in March. The entire performing arts department is currently working on the all school musical. This year's show is Disney's The Little Mermaid. This full-scale production involves band, orchestra, choir, and drama students.

### 90% Attendance, Tardy Policies, and Procedures

VBHS has a 90% Attendance Policy, which means students must attend 90% of their classes in order to participate in sports, extracurricular activities, clubs and/ or privileges (parking, dances, Grad Bash, Prom, etc.). Students may participate in practices, rehearsals, etc. but may not participate, compete, or perform in athletic games, performances, and extracurricular events until they are in compliance with the 90% Attendance Policy.

Please note that for a tardy to be excused, a parent/guardian must physically sign the student in at the attendance desk or the student needs to provide a medical or court note for the time missed. NO phone calls to excuse a tardy. If a student has been called out of class by attendance to be able to leave campus, the student must sign out at the attendance desk and receive a pass to leave campus for the absence to be excused. To have a student called to leave campus, you must be on the contact list in Focus. There is also no early release for students after 1:25pm.
