A Message From The Chief

Dear VBHS Family,

We have had a very busy school year so far with a number of accomplishments and accolades to report. This month, we will host Parent/teacher conference night to provide parents a time to meet with teachers individually. In the coming weeks, we will begin individually meeting with students to create their class schedule for next school year. Winter sports seasons are finishing, spring sports are beginning, and performing arts are in their competitive season. There is always a whirlwind of

activity on this campus, and I thank the parents, teachers, coaches, directors, and staff for making this such a wonderful place to teach and learn.

Our graduation rate continues to rise. Our percentage of graduates has risen each year for the past 5 years. This year's state report recently released showed improvement to 96.14%.VBHS Bands participated in the Florida Bandmasters Association Solo and Ensemble/Color Guard Music Performance Assessment. 77 superior medals were award to student musicians who performed solos or small ensembles. 9 Color Guard soloists received superior ratings and the Indoor Color Guard received a superior rating. Voices of Vero (chorus) competed at the Florida Vocal Association solo and ensemble festival and received a superior rating. Our VBHS Drama and Performing arts Department has prepared our school musical "Matilda" and will begin performances during February here in our James M. Sammons Auditorium. Winter sports seasons are finishing up in Vero tradition with strong seasons. Our Girls Weightlifting Team are the FHSAA Region 4 Champions for the 7th straight year. This month all our spring sports get underway, so stay tuned for more sports action.

We want our students to realize the tremendous importance of attending school daily, and the terribly negative impact that "non-attendance" has on a student's academic outcomes. Parents, we ask that you closely monitor your student's attendance. We find too often, that parents of truant students do not realize how much school their child is missing, until it is a big problem with irreparable repercussions. Please encourage your child to be in school and attend all their classes every day.

This month, we will host Parent/teacher conference to provide parents a time to meet with teachers individually. On January 31, 2023, awards were given out for the 31st annual Indian River Regional Science Fair. All VBHS students who participated walked home with an award!

Jaya Vernese & Ella Kilman conducted a study on the concentration of microplastics in local waterways, and they were earned the Stockholm Junior Water Prize as well as 1st place in the Earth & Environmental Science category.

Kimberly Ung-Davy conducted a study on the impact of Covid quarantine on various teen age groups. She was awarded the 1st place prize in the Behavioral & Social Sciences category.

Web Webster conducted an experiment on the impact of microplastics on seagrass root strength and was awarded an \$80,000 Florida Institute of Technology scholarship, Harbor Branch Award, and the 1st place spot in the Plant Sciences category.

Elizabeth De Schouwer was awarded the Office of Naval Research Award, the first place prize in the cellular/molecular biology & biochemistry category.

Kimberly, Web, and Elizabeth will all go on to compete at the Florida State Science & Engineering Fair in April, AND Elizabeth was awarded the prestigious honor of attending the Regeneron International Science & Engineering Fair to be held in Dallas this May.

Attendance Matters

Chronic unexcused absences will negatively affect a student's progress in high school, keep them from eligibility to participate in extracurricular activities, suspend privileges, and if fact the State of Florida may suspend their driver's license. In addition to all this, there is a new district wide attendance policy for secondary students (grades 6-12) who are "habitually truant" which is defined as; "10 unexcused absences in any one core course per semester". According to policy; for habitually truant students, the school attendance committee will meet at the end of each semester and may withhold credits for students who are habitually truant. Students are regularly reminded of this policy at school and encouraged to attend their classes, so that they do not lose credits towards graduation due to habitual truancy.

90% Attendance, Tardy Policies, and Procedures

VBHS has a 90% Attendance Policy, which means students must attend 90% of their classes in order to participate in sports, extracurricular activities, clubs and/ or privileges (parking, dances, Grad Bash, Prom, etc.). Students may participate in practices, rehearsals, etc. but may not participate, compete, or perform in athletic games, performances, and extracurricular events until they are in compliance with the 90% Attendance Policy.

Please note that for a tardy to be excused, a parent/guardian must physically sign the student in at the attendance desk or the student needs to provide a medical or court note for the time missed. NO phone calls to excuse a tardy. If a student has been called out of class by attendance to be able to leave campus, the student must sign out at the attendance desk and receive a pass to leave campus for the absence to be excused. To have a student called to leave campus, you must be on the contact list in Focus. There is also no early release for students after 1:22pm.

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Winter Athletics

Boys and Girls Soccer

At the start of the season both the Girls' and Boys' Soccer teams prepared to play a very tough schedule. The teams worked, prepared, and overcame obstacles all season in order to compete and participate in the sport they love. Both programs had successful seasons, and both lost in the district semi-finals.

Boys Basketball

The Boys Basketball team ended with a tough 1-pt loss to Treasure Coast High School in the first round of the District Tournament. The Indians finished the season with 7 wins. The team was led by Senior Derrick Davey who averaged 15.2 points per game. Junior Jaylen Shelly was second on the team in scoring with 11.8 points per game.

Girls Basketball

Tay Dawson leads all Lady Indian scorers averaging 21 points 9 rebounds and 5 assists per game. Ariyah Brown has averaged 16 points and 8 rebounds per game and Jaida Civil has 12 points 5 rebounds 8 assists and 5 steals per game. The Lady Indians knocked out Centenial High School 65-24 and will now travel to Dr. Phillips in Orlando for a regional playoff game.

Boys Wrestling

The 2022-23 Wrestling Team had seen its largest turnout to date. A total of 48 wrestlers joined this years program. The Varsity Wrestlers have had a stellar season finishing top 3 in each tournament they have participated in and Team Champions of the last 3 tournaments they have entered in. The Fighting Indians Wrestlers are currently unbeatened in Dual Meets this year as well.

Currently five wrestlers are in the top 20 of the State in 3a. Kevin Benjamin 138lbs, David Benjamin 160lbs, Cooper Patton 170 lbs., Johnathan Roberts 195 lbs and JaQuone Jean 220 lbs.

The Fighting Indians Wrestlers have two Dual Meets and one Tournament left to the regular season before heading into the District Tournament being held at Ft Pierce Centeal HS.

Girls Weightlifting

The Vero Beach Girls Weightlifting Team won the 7th straight District and Regional Championships. During these two meets 10 school records were broken. There will be 12 girls from the team going to compete in FHSAA Girl's Weightlifting State Meet on February 18th to defend their State Championship from last year.

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
