### A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Hello Lion Family!

It has been a great start to the school year. I welcome many new students and a large 9th grade class with over 300 students. I would like to personally commend our 9th graders on their behavior. It has been a pleasure starting the 19-20 school year with such a positive group of young adults.

At this time students should be well into content and learning with grades reflecting their performance. Parents should be checking Schoology regularly to mentor students with grade monitoring. This year one of our school improvement plan goals is to reduce the number of students ineligible for extra-curricular activities and athletics. We take extreme PRIDE in our achievements outside of the classroom. Before we can build championship teams we must first nurture students who champion learning and academic achievement. We believe that every student should find an activity of interest to participate in while in high school. Engagement in extra-curricular directly correlates with higher academic performance. When parents, students and educators share the responsibility of grade monitoring and management overall student achievement increases. Our teachers have shared Schoology access codes with all their students and many have sent letters home to parents with instructions for access. A good rule of thumb is to check your child's grade every 6-8 school days.

As part of our mission to be strong and unified we value maintaining a culture that is welcoming for our students. Parents are encouraged to be familiar with FCPS Policy 443 and Regulation 400-36 as well as Regulation 400-48. This information can be found on the FCPS webpage under the Board of Education tab in the Policy and Regulation link. Regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, sexual identity, socio-economic stability, community familiarity, disability or academic placement; all students at Walkersville High School are valued and have equitable access to support. Our teachers, counselors and administrators believe every student is to be given an opportunity to be successful in a nurturing environment with fair and consistent expectations for the safety of all who co-exist inside our walls. This too is an area where parents play a major role in school climate. Monitoring your child's use of technology, social media and peer interactions is essential during the adolescent years. Nearly all bullying and harassing cases investigated at the school level root from social media or text communication. Please be familiar with current apps, chat platforms and interactive sites. Parents are welcome to contact a counselor or administrator with questions or to solicit more information on current trends.

Just a few reminders to close out my thoughts for the fall semester. Please make sure students are arriving on time. Students can fail or lose credit in their block 1 class for repetitive late arrivals and time missed unlawful. Thank you for your cooperation in our car-line drop-off each morning. Pulling all the way up to the blue drop off sign increases the number of cars unloading students at one time. This directly impacts traffic and allows for a more consistent flow of cars entering and exiting the front circle. HATS and HOODS are not permitted in school. This tends to be a daily issue with a very small portion of the population. The administration will take disciplinary action for those who continue to defy redirection and FCPS Policy 439. This also applies to students who are not dressing appropriately wearing revealing clothing.

We thank everyone for a wonderful start to the school year. I personally want to thank our Senior Parents for attending the Senior meetings in September. We are excited to lead the Class of 2020 to graduation on June 3rd at Mount Saint Mary's University.

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




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#### **PTSA NEWS**

#### **COUNSELING OFFICE SERVICES**

- Transcripts OFFICIAL transcripts are FREE upon request from <u>current</u> students. Please allow 24 hours' notice for transcript only requests; see Mrs. Cardy in the Counseling Office. There is also no charge if requesting an <u>electronic transcript</u> through Naviance. Please allow two weeks processing time for letters of recommendation. All hard copies of completed correspondence, letters of recommendation, and transcripts are to be picked up from the Counseling Office and must be <u>mailed by the student</u>.
- **Duplicate Diploma Requests** There is a \$15.00 fee for a duplicate diploma. Checks should be made payable to and mailed to Frederick County Public Schools (191 East Street, Frederick, MD) to the attention of Debbie Foreman. Include the following information: Full legal name at the time of graduation; school of graduation; year of graduation; current address and phone numbers. Please allow up to 5 weeks for processing.

#### **PROOF OF RESIDENCY**

Have you moved? Did you know that whenever you move, you must provide your child's school with a current (within 30 days) proof of residency? This is a Maryland state requirement. Acceptable proof of residency is as follows (only **one** of the following is required):

- Current Lease/Rental Agreement signed by both the landlord and the biological parent/legal guardian the student is residing with. If the lease is in a name of someone other than the biological parent/legal guardian, a Parent Residency Affidavit will also have to be completed in the presence of a notary and provided along with the lease. The Parent Residency Affidavit may be found by going to www.fcps.org, forms, and Student Services Forms.
- Current Utility Bill (gas, electric, water/sewer bill) in the name of the biological parent/legal guardian the student is residing with. If the bill is in a name of someone other than the biological parent/legal guardian, a Parent Residency Affidavit will also have to be completed in the presence of a notary and provided along with the utility bill. The Parent Residency Affidavit may be found by going to www.fcps.org, forms, and Student Services Forms.

\*\*\* Please note that we are unable to accept cable, phone, or insurance bills as proof of residency.

#### **ENROLLMENT APPOINTMENTS**

Student enrollments are done by appointment only. We do **NOT** do walkin appointments. Please contact Mrs. Meyer at 240-236-7208 or deanna. meyer@fcps.org if you would like to set up an appointment. Please note that 2019 Walkersville Middle School 8th graders residing in the Walkersville feeder are automatically enrolled as freshmen at Walkersville High School and do not need to be formally enrolled.



FCPS provides public transportation to/from a student's <u>residence</u> only. Transportation to jobs, social meetings, and other non-school events is a parental responsibility. Students may ride only their assigned bus. Inviting friends home on the bus makes it hard for schools and bus drivers to account for students and can cause bus capacity problems. <u>In an emergency</u>, principals may approve a parent's request to allow a child to ride another bus (bus drivers will need a note signed by both students' parents and school administration).

#### **HOW TO APPLY TO THE CAREER & TECHNOLOGY** CENTER

The Career & Technology Center is part of the Frederick County Public Schools System. CTC programs are available in a variety of areas ranging from the traditional vocational areas to college preparatory programs. Students can earn credits as well as industry certifications and licenses. Programs are taught in half-day blocks and students attend WHS for the other half of the day.

Shadowing a program is the first, required step in the application process and is open to students in grades 9-11. Speak with Mrs. Cardy in the Counseling Office to sign up for shadowing as soon as possible. The time frame for shadowing begins in November and runs through February. A student may shadow up to two programs. Once you have an appointment, you will be given a permission slip which requires a parent signature and should be returned to Mrs. Cardy in the Counseling Office.

On the day shadowing takes place, you will ride the bus (either AM or PM as designated by CTC) to and from CTC for half of the day. It is very important that you shadow on the date that has been arranged. Absence from school in order to shadow at CTC is excused; however, you will be required to make up the work that you miss.

During the shadowing session, you will receive information on how to complete an application to attend CTC next year. A personal interview and evaluation of your shadowing

experience, attendance, and GPA are the main criteria for acceptance into any CTC program. The application is to be completed online or returned to Mrs. Cardy as soon as possible.

#### COLLEGE ENTRANCE TESTING

Seniors planning to re-take the SAT or ACT should do so as soon as possible in the 2019-20 school year. Juniors will take the SAT **for free** during the school day on March 4, 2020. It is recommended that juniors re-test following the March administration in either June or August. The ACT is another option for students wishing to take a college entrance exam. Almost all colleges will accept either score as part of a college application.
