Speech & Debate

Along with a return to the classroom after 19 months of COVID-related virtual learning, the Wellington Speech & Debate Team has resumed in-person weekend competition with a flourish.



At their first in-person competition in September, the Red Dawn Debaters enjoyed incredible success, taking home numerous accolades from the September PBCFL Congressional Debate Tournament at Suncoast, In first-year high school novice competition, Emma Gardner and Emma Segfeldt each placed third in their respective chambers, while three students - Olivia Winton, Patrick McDermott, and Paula Currea - each placed fourth. Taking fifth was Emilia Richards, and another trio of first-year debaters placed sixth: Madison Neltner, Alexandra Versailles, and Colin Capon. Andin Varsity Congress, both Samuel Johnson and Ewa Tryniszewski placed first overall, and Hannah Pahl took sixth. In addition, five students earned gavels as their chamber's top presiding officer - KJ Benham, Colin Gibson, Chelsea Gutierrez, Sofia Lynch, and Shaida Meier.

Wellington hosted the October PBCFL, where Wellington took first-place honors in Declamation (Ana Guillaume, with straight 1's) and Novice Oral Interpretation (Madison Neltner). In fact, Wellington took four of the top six spots in Novice OI, with Ayman Omar placing second, Stacy Joseph third, and Andreanna Wellington sixth. In addition, Hannah Pahl placed second in Varsity OI, Colin Gibson third in Varsity Extemp, Olivia Winton third in Declamation, and Emma Gardner fourth in Congress.

Wellington Speech & Debate enjoyed success at the November PBCFL at Park Vista. In Novice Dramatic Performance, Anneliese Leclef took first place. In Novice Public Forum Debate, the team of Emma Gardner & Patrick McDermott went 3-1 and placed fifth overall. In Oral Interpretation, Paula Currea took sixth place In Congressional Debate, Ewa Tryniszewski placed first in her chamber and earned a Chamber's Choice Presiding Office gavel, while David Goldberg finished sixth in his chamber. In Extemporaneous Speaking, Samuel Johnson placed second and Simran Josan fourth.


Wellington fared extremely well at the inaugural National Civics and Debate Championship tournament in Orlando November 12-14. The tournament - Wellington's first out-of-area competition since March 2020 - saw 10 Red Dawn Debaters compete in four different events, which dealt with civics-related topics and arguments. In Congressional Debate, out of 130 competitors, Ray Estevez placed fifth and Lauren Beer took seventh. In addition, Jason Miller placed 19th. In Impromptu Speaking, Samuel Johnson took eighth place and Ray Estevez 15th. In Extemporaneous Debate, Jason Miller went 6-0 and took ninth place. And in Extemporaneous Sports Analysis, Samuel Johnson finished fourth overall. As a team, Wellington placed sixth in the overall tournament sweepstakes.

Wellington Speech & Debate took a leisurely stroll to its neighbor to the east, Palm Beach Central, and left the December PBCFL with an impressive number of accolades. The Red Dawn Debaters took the top three spots in Novice Oral Interpretation: Maria Ramirez (1st), Madison Neltner (2nd), and Karola Ortiz Rodriguez (3rd). In Dramatic Performance, Jaiden Lagalo-Blinston took first overall. Two Wolverines placed second in their respective Extemporaneous Speaking events: Adrian Perez-Rodriguez in Novice Extemp, and Samuel Johnson in Varsity Extemp. Wellington took third in two novice-specific debate events: Paula Currea in Novice Lincoln Douglas Debate, and the team of Emma Gardner & Patrick McDermott in Novice Public Forum Debate. In Novice Congressional Debate, Emma Segfeldt took third in her chamber, Elani

Mohammed placed fourth, Arthur Hu-Manning took sixth, and Noor El Tohamy was named her chamber's top Presiding Officer. Sofia Lynch earned a gavel as her varsity senate's top Presiding Officer. While not taking home hardware, Carolina Aguilera scored a rare double in Congressional Debate, as she simultaneously judged and presided over a novice Congress House in the morning session. Chiara Mirazzi took second in Novice Informative Speaking.
