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

# Advanced Placement Biology News 2020-21

Advanced Placement Biology students have been studying Molecular Genetics (DNA), evolution and Ecology this semester. The class has studied PCR and recombinant DNA technology which is being used to diagnose Covid 19 as well as make the mRNA vaccine. AP Biology students have performed many college level experiments using a virtual simulation platform called Labster. We conducted an evolution experiment using candy fish to analyze how a physical trait seen by a predator makes a particular fish type more likely to survive. Students have designed and run an experiment at home to test preference behavior in an animal of their choice and use statistics to calculate if their data is scientifically accurate. While we were not able to do the glow in the dark pGLO bacteria lab in person, we watched video of the experimental procedure and results and then analyzed the data as if we had smeared them on the plates ourselves! If experimentation in biological topics is interesting to you, please sign up for AP Biology for next year as this course is the perfect preparation for Pre-Vet, Pre-Med and biomedical research college majors!

# Equine/Pre-Vet Academy News

The Academy students had a veterinarian from Palm Beach Equine Hospital provide a live tour of the hospital and presented how biosecurity is performed in an animal hospital setting. She also discussed the advanced imaging technology available in the hospital as well as the surgical room and the medical procedures that are performed there. The juniors also had a presentation from Keiser University on the Pre Veterinary and Equine science programs they offer at their West Palm Beach Campus in addition to their equestrian team that students could join. She discussed the key planning process for high school students in choosing their college and major. She offered great advice to these students on how to plan for the next few years. The Vet Biology 2 students have been researching and presenting on animal diseases, including how Covid affects animals and the role that veterinarians play in this pandemic. The 9th grade Vet students have been studying animal parasites, dentistry and companion animal anatomy. Our Academy students are enjoying some unique and exciting topics in the program for sure!

# Debate Good News

The nationally recognized Wellington High School Speech & Debate Team continued its 2020-21 Virtual Tour with sustained success during the second semester.

Three first-year Wellington debaters advanced to finals at the Florida Forensic League Novice State championship in April. Emma Stanfield placed second overall in Dramatic Interpretation, Colin Gibson finished sixth in Extemporaneous Speaking, and KJ Benham placed sixth in Declamation.

At the 2021 Florida Forensic League State championship in early March, Jaiden Lagalo-Blinston placed third overall in Dramatic Interpretation. In addition, Lillian Paulitz advanced to semifinals in Humorous Interpretation, Lagalo-Blinston to semifinals in Program Oral Interpretation, and Director of Speech & Debate Paul Gaba was recognized as FFL Macaw Region Coach of the Year.

The state championship followed two national championship tournament qualifiers, which saw Wellington qualify numerous students. Ten Red Dawn Debaters will represent Wellington at the 2021 National Catholic Forensic League's virtual Grand National championship tournament Memorial Day Weekend. In Oral Interpretation, McKenna Wickers picket-fenced her five rounds of poetry and prose, placing first overall. Isabella Tombari and Harrison Winton will also compete in OI. Three Wellington debaters qualified in Extemporaneous Speaking – Samuel Johnson, Gonzalo Pardo Zambrano, and Colin Gibson. In Dramatic Performance, Paulitz and Lagalo-Blinston will compete, as will KJ Benham in Oratorical Declamation and Daniel Melton in Original Oratory.

In addition, four Red Dawn Debaters qualified for the 2021 National Speech and Debate of Virtual National Tournament in June: Lagalo-Blinston in Dramatic Interpretation, Nicholas Raney in Foreign Extemporaneous, Emma Stanfield in Humorous Interpretation, and Paulitz in Humorous Interpretation. In addition, Kieran Abesamis is 1st Alternate in Lincoln Douglas Debate, and McKenna Wickers is 1st Alternate in Program Oral Interpretation. Gaba is Florida Oceanfront NSDA District Coach of the Year.

At the 46th annual UPenn Liberty Bell Classic over Valentine's Day Weekend, Lagalo-Blinston finished sixth in Program Oral Interpretation and advanced to quarterfinals in Dramatic Interpretation. In addition, Paulitz broke to semifinals in Humorous Interpretation, placing ninth overall.
