With the start of the second semester, it is time to start preparing for state assessments. During the first week of April, all students will be taking the Florida Standards Assessment in writing. 7th & 8th graders will take the writing assessment on the computer, while 6th grade students take a paper-based version. Our language arts teachers have been working hard to prepare our students through standards-based instruction, with a focus on writing using evidence. Furthermore, teachers in all subjects have supported writing by writing across the curriculum. This includes students taking Cornell notes in chorus, real-life research projects in math, writing tasks in physical education, and lab reports in science. It is One Pack preparing our Wolves to become exceptional writers!

Following the writing assessment, the reading and math assessments will occur during the month of May, along with the Civics and Algebra end of course assessments. Our students are working hard and our teachers are making sure they are well-prepared for the assessments. To support both parents and students, we will have several Parent's as Partners Saturday sessions in April and May. These sessions allow parents to learn alongside their child on a Saturday morning with our awesome teachers leading the learning. Superintendent's Reading Challenge

Students should record the books they read between October 1, 2019 and March 6, 2020 on the reading log provided by their ELA teacher. The reading logs will be collected in March and students who meet the goal of reading 12 or more books will receive recognition for their accomplishment.





John M. McKay Scholarship for Students with Disabilities Program

Required notification to parents/guardians of students with disabilities:

Your child <u>may</u> be eligible to participate in the John M. McKay Scholarship for Students with Disabilities Program for the 2020-21 school year.

To be eligible for the McKay Scholarship Program, a student must apply for the program prior to withdrawing from public school. The student must have an Individual Education Plan (IEP), or 504 Accommodation Plan issued under section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (with duration of more than six months), and:

- Have been enrolled and reported for funding in a public school for the school year prior to applying for a scholarship (Grades K-12) (foster student may be exempt from the requirement); or
- Have been a prekindergarten student who was enrolled and reported for funding in a Florida public school during the school year prior to applying for a scholarship; or
- Have received specialized instructional services under the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program from an approved provider pursuant to section 1002.66, Florida Statutes, during the previous school year; or
- Have attended the Florida School for the Deaf and Blind during the preceding school year's student membership surveys (Grades K-12).

To find out if your student is eligible, you may apply for the McKay Scholarship Program on the School Choice website at www.floridaschoolchoice.org . Select the McKay Scholarships link, then Parents, and then the link titled Apply for a McKay Scholarship.

To learn more about your child's educational options, please contact the District McKay contact at (352)253-6600. You may also contact the Florida Department of Education, Office of Independent Education and Parental Choice Information Hotline at 1-800-447-1636, or visit the School Choice website at www.floridaschoolchoice.org and click the McKay Scholarships link.

In order for a student to be eligible for the program, intent to participate in the McKay Scholarship Program must be filed on the School Choice website prior to withdrawing from public school. The deadline to apply for the first payment period of the 2020-2021 school year is July 3, 2020.

This is notification to you that your child may be eligible to participate in the McKay Scholarship Program. This notice does not guarantee your student's eligibility.

6th Grade TDAP Immunization Clinic at WHMS!!!!!

April 21, 2020 during school. All students must have their Tdap vaccination before entering 7th grade and will not be allowed to start school in the fall without it!

The immunization Permission Consent forms will be mailed to the parents of students needing their Tdap in February, 2020.

Tips and Strategies for Testing

As testing season will soon be approaching for our students, it is helpful for them to become acclimated with the expectations of testing. Sixth graders will be taking the paper-based assessment and, seventh and eighth graders will be taking the computer based assessment. The following website can be used to practice for the FSA's. It also provides a test guide so students can become acquainted with the use of the computer-based assessment, especially for those taking it for the first time in seventh grade. The website below will allow students to practice for the FSA.

 In addition, it is important for students will prepare in other ways besides practicing online.
- 1. Be sure to get a good night's sleep the night before your assessment.
- 2. Eat a balanced breakfast the day of your assessment.
- 3. Establish comfort with technology. This includes learning how to highlight, underline and navigate through the assessment.

Testing Information

Please review the following policies with your student/child before testing:

- Electronic Devices—Students **are not** permitted to have any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing or during breaks (e.g., restroom), even if the devices are turned off or students do not use them. If your student is found with an electronic device, his or her test will be invalidated.
- Calculators—Calculators **are not** permitted during Grades 6 Mathematics tests.
- Testing Rules Acknowledgment—All FSA tests include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment printed in the student's test and answer book that reads: "I understand the testing rules that were just read to me. If I do not follow these rules, my test score may be invalidated." Prior to testing, test administrators read the rules to students, and students acknowledge that they understand the testing rules by signing below the statement in their test and answer book.
- Discussing Test Content after Testing—The last portion of the testing rules read to students before they sign below the Testing Rules Acknowledgment states: "Because the content in all statewide assessments is secure, you may not discuss or reveal details about the test content (including test items, passages, and prompts) after the test. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting online, for example, on Facebook, Twitter, Snapchat, or Instagram." Please make sure your student understands that "discussing" test content includes any kind of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, posting to social media, or sharing online. While students may not share information about secure test content after testing, this policy is not intended to prevent students from discussing their testing experiences with their parents/families.
- Working Independently—Students are responsible for doing their own work during the test and for protecting their answers from being seen by others. If students are caught cheating during testing, their tests will be invalidated. In addition, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) employs Caveon Test Security to analyze student test results to detect unusually similar answer patterns. Student tests within a school that are found to have extremely similar answer patterns will be invalidated.
- Leaving Campus—If your student leaves campus before completing a test session (e.g., for lunch, an appointment, illness), he or she will not be allowed to return to that test session. If your student does not feel well on the day of testing, it may be best for him or her to wait and be tested on a make-up day. Please remember not to schedule appointments on testing days.
- Testing Accommodations—If your student has an Individual Education Plan (IEP), a Section 504 plan, or is an English Language Learner (ELL), please contact the school to discuss the testing accommodations that will be provided for your student.





Windy Hill Work Study Program

During these tough economic times many students have missed out on the opportunity to attend fieldtrips. The College and Career Prep Team at WHMS has worked to raise funds to help deserving students have the opportunity to participate in academic and end of school year field trips. In order to help students receive positive merits of working towards a goal, and to most fairly distribute field trip funds, C2 Prep Team has established a work-study program. Students will need to meet eligibility requirements in order to apply for the program. These requirements are based on teacher and administrator references, attendance record, discipline record, and financial need. Students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch will have priority in earning a work study position; however, applying to the program does not guarantee that your child will be accepted into the program. Applications can be obtained in Portable L. Completed work study applications must be turned in to Mrs. Woods or her mailbox in the front office.

Work-study participants will be notified within a week of application and will be matched with a participating teacher if accepted into the program. A timesheet of hours worked must be kept by the student and signed by the participating teacher. There will be a spot on the work-study application for your child to indicate their preferred volunteer position (in a classroom, the guidance department, or with a custodian) as well as preferred volunteer time (before school or after school). Classroom and guidance positions may entail students performing administrative tasks, helping to clean, etc. A custodial position may entail helping wipe down tables/desks, sweep, empty classroom trashcans, etc. In order to increase your child's chance of getting selected for this program, it is recommended that he/she be willing to work in all three categories. All work must be done outside school hours, meaning before 9am or after 4:30pm. Parents are responsible for dropping their child off or picking their child up on time.

Students will receive \$8 of field trip assistance for every hour volunteered. Students may volunteer in half hour increments. A \$60 trip will necessitate seven and a half hours of volunteer work. Students may only earn the cost of the field trip's ticket, transportation, or other costs that would be paid to the school such as t-shirts. Once students have completed the necessary number of hours, the teacher in charge of the field trip they are seeking to participate in will be notified that the C2 Prep Team will be covering the cost of the field trip. Students will also receive an award certificate documenting the hours completed and field trip earned. Funds will be directly managed at the school, any unused funds will be returned to the field trip fund. If a child becomes **ineligible** for a field trip because of academic or disciplinary reasons, any funds already earned will be returned to the field trip fund.







8th Grade Bon Voyage and Gradventure

All forms and payment must be turned in by 9:15 a.m. on March 6th – **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

In order for Windy Hill Middle School to provide our 8th grade students with a fun and exciting send off to high school we need your help. Parent volunteers are needed to help organize and make preparations for our 8th grade class of 2020.

We will be holding several parent planning meetings for Bon Voyage over the next several months. Make sure to listen to Mr. Roberts' weekly call outs and our web site for dates and times.

This event has always been Windy Hill's grand finale for our 8th graders. With your help we can make this year's event one that will make our students proud of their accomplishments as they move on to high school.
