Students that applied for the new 7th grade intermediate culinary class for the 2019-2020 school year will find out if they have been placed in the class when they receive their schedules in the fall. Students that are placed in this class will take the Food Handler certification exam and will help operate the food market in our school. Those that do not get into the intermediate class for 7th grade may still have the opportunity to be in the regular 7th grade semester culinary class in either the fall or spring.

Upcoming 8th grade students that applied for the advanced culinary class will also find out if they were selected when they receive their schedules in the fall. Students that have been selected for this class will have an intense, but, fun and exciting year in culinary. They will be working towards their industry certification during the first semester. Second semester, students work on food trucks and career projects. They take what they learned in the semester class and apply that learning to all aspects of this class. They also operate the Wolves Café, Wolfies Bites and Beverages, and much more.





Below are some strategies to help your child connect in the reading process.

- 1. Encourage your child to enroll in your local library's summer reading program. It is never too late to have your child join a library. Some libraries have programs that will reward students with prizes and/or giveaways.
- 2. Find a reading list that corresponds with your child's age or interests.

Ask your child what they are interested in reading about. It doesn't matter what interest your child has, there are books music, sports, nature, magic, etc. You can also access the internet for reading lists on many different subjects/ topics.

3. Get them hooked on a great series.

There are many book series out there students have already taken a liking to, for example, The Hunger Games, Divergent, Twilight, Harry Potter, Stranded, Wildwood Chronicles, The Keepers Trilogy, The Mysterious Benedict Society, Half Upon a Time. If your child has read the first book in a series, encourage them to continue reading the books that follow.

4. Mix it up by practicing foreign language skills.

Edutopia has a great link for playing games with your child, whether it be perfecting their English language skills or brushing up on a foreign language they took during the school year. 5. Recognize the ties between music and literature.

Help your child understand the connection to their favorite lyrics from a song and poetry. The same principles and creative aspects that are used in poetry and literature are also used in music. Encourage your child to write a song, or express their thoughts on the lyrics. This will help with literacy building.

6. Suggest keeping a travel diary.

If your family is headed on vacation during the summer, have your child write about their adventures. Writing about their adventures will help promote better writing skills.

7. Give your teen a private, cool reading space.

Motivate your child to read by providing them with quiet space to read. You don't have to rearrange the furniture for this, but clearing out a small space in the corner of a room will do the trick. Add a bean bag or their favorite chair to the corner where they can have a spot of their own to relax and dive into their favorite book.

8. Take advantage of fun educational apps.

9. Read with your child.


The best way to connect with your child is to read with them. Take the opportunity to read the same book together and encourage discussion about characters, plot, setting, etc. Reading with your child sets a powerful example of what it means to be a good reader and thinker.





2019 Season Volleyball Information

- 2019 Summer Skill Camp Information is posted on the WHMS website under '*Athletics* → *Volleyball* → 2019 Summer Camp Information' for athletes interested in local club clinics.
- Prior to the beginning of intramurals, an informational meeting will be held for both athletes and parents set tentatively for the first week of school. *Please review the pre-season Powerpoint on the WHMS website if you are unable to attend.*
- The WHMS volleyball season will run from August of 2019 through November of 2019.
- Intramurals will last a duration of three weeks before the traveling team is selected. Intramurals are held before school from 7:00am to 8:45am in the WHMS gym. Intramural dates will be released at the informational meeting in August.
- In order to participate in intramurals and tryouts *EVERY athlete must have a completed athletic eligibility packet on file completed <u>after June 1st</u> prior to attending.*
- Athletic packets are on the WHMS website, *Athletes who arrive to intramurals without* a completed packet will not be allowed to participate and it will not count toward their attended hours.
- Intramurals serve to condition athletes as well as provide coaching in basic fundamental volleyball skills. Athletes must be present for 50% of the intramural hours to be eligible to make the traveling team.
- Students should plan to attend all intramural dates and expect to participate in athletic conditioning including plyometrics, sprinting, strength building, circuit training, and more. 100% of the student's individual effort is expected.
- The travel team will be selected at the end of intramurals through the use of a volleyball scoring rubric that can be found and reviewed on WHMS's school website.
- The athletes chosen for the traveling team will be selected objectively and will have accumulated the highest twelve rubric scores.
- The rubric will allow athletes to be scored on passing, setting, serving, hitting, movement, communication, team play, and sportsmanship.
