Families, thank you for an EXCEPTIONAL start to the 2020-21 school year! I am so proud of our staff, students, and parents for a smooth opening of school, during a most unusual time! At the writing of this letter, we are well into our normal operating procedures and your child is doing wonderfully! I appreciate our Wolves wearing their mask and ID badges every day, being on time to their classes, and putting forth maximum effort. As a school, we will ensure we provide your child with engaging, standards-based instruction, in a positive and safe classroom environment!

This year, we continue to focus on authentic literacy, specifically engaging the students in activities that include reading, writing, thinking, and discourse. As a leadership team, we will be coaching teachers through feedback to afford all of our Wolves opportunities to read, write, and talk about their thinking. Our goal is that students are participating in reading based activities for at least half of the school day. You can support the effort at home by ensuring that your child is reading for a minimum of 30 minutes nightly. Even encourage your child to read to you to help build fluency and their ability to read in front of others. As we move into the fall season, our sports teams are kicking into high gear, with cross-country and volleyball beginning games in October! In addition, our performing arts department is preparing for their upcoming performances. Please be sure to visit our school website and listen to our weekly callout message for upcoming events, along with new procedures for all events, as safety is our paramount concern!

Did you know that we are a National Demonstration School for AVID? AVID stands for Advancement via Individual Determination and it is our goal to ensure ALL of our Wolves leave WHMS ready for what's next. This includes college, career, technical school, and the military. AVID provides our Wolves with the tools and habits to be a successful student and lifelong learner. The last Friday of each month is designated as AVID Friday and your child will be learning about a different college or career on AVID Friday. In August, students learned about the University of Florida during x-block on AVID Friday, and at the end of September, the focus will be the military. Be sure to ask your child about it!


Lake Live Learning

Parents and students:

If you have a child attending Lake Live there are certain guidelines your child must follow as if they were attending school in person. Please review these guidelines with your child so they are aware of the expectations. It is also important to use home time wisely as if your child were in the classroom.

Guidelines:

- 1. Please be sure your child is logging in a few minutes early before their class begins. This way they can check their audio and be sure their camera is working. If they receive an error message, there is a chance the teacher has not started the class. Wait one minute and try again.
- Students need to have their camera/video on at all times. This is part of their attendance for the class and a non-negotiable. If your child is having technical issues with the school issued Chromebook, please complete the form in this link <u>https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1F</u> <u>AIpQLSe9KuCDrwJd4XVgB2TgSLKGv22ESyLMCrOD-EXBb_yuLE9oSQ/viewform</u> and a district technician will contact you with next steps.



- 3. Students must be dressed in acceptable school attire during all Lake Live classes.
- 4. Students should be in a room with minimal distractions so they can concentrate and hear the teacher.
- 5. Students should be working on ONLY the classwork they are logged-in for at that time.
- 6. Use school etiquette when communicating with others through Google Meet. Please remember, when your microphone is live, conversations can be heard by everyone in attendance.

Health Screenings

To all 6th grade parents:

The School Health Team from the Department of Health of Lake County will be at Windy Hill Middle School to perform health screening on Tuesday, November 3 for the 2020-2021 school year. They will perform Growth and Development, Vision, and Hearing screenings.



The screening process used is not diagnostic.

Screenings are intended to identify children with a wide range of problems that families should follow- up with professional examinations. As with any screening process, there is no assurance that all problems will be detected. No screening process is a substitute for a full examination by qualified professionals.

Superintendent's Reading Challenge

WHMS invites students to participate in the 2020-2021 Superintendent's Reading Challenge. Please encourage your student to read and participate in this important opportunity by reading 12 books on the student's reading level. Students should record the books they read between October 2, 2020 and March 5, 2021 on the reading log provided by their ELA teacher. Welcome to a new a school year! Things are moving along in our culinary arts department. This year we welcome 6th graders to the culinary program. They are the first cohort that will be going through the program this year, and it is very exciting. Sixth graders start with beginning culinary, then move to Hospitality and Tourism for 7th grade, and then 30 students will be chosen for the advanced culinary in 8th grade. It is sure to be an exciting couple of years for everyone.

Class dues help in purchasing certification tests, personal culinary hats, and cooking/cleaning supplies in class. All dues can be paid through the school website for convenience.

Beginning students are wrapping up safety and starting on sanitation. They, along with the Hospitality and Tourism students, will be working towards earning their Food Handler certification. This certificate demonstrates understanding of safety and sanitation in the kitchen. This is also a requirement for students to work in the kitchens. Our advanced students will be working towards earning the NRFSP Food Manager certification in the winter. This is the next certification up from Food Handler. This industry certification is good for five years and gives them an edge in the employment area.

With COVID affecting much of what is happening in and out of school, please know that I will be taking the utmost caution when having students working in the kitchens. I already have high expectations, but now they have grown even more. Students are always required to wear hats, aprons, and gloves when working with food. In addition, they MUST earn their certifications and wear face masks to be in the kitchens. They will also be working in smaller groups/pairs to limit how many students are in the kitchens. Which means labs will go throughout the week.

We are still planning to have our yearly delicious fundraisers. In the coming weeks, watch for our Caramel Apple and Caramel Popcorn fundraiser to begin. Culinary and hospitality students, both Lake Live and Face to Face, will be selling homemade caramel apples and popcorn for the fall season. These items are made fresh in house, not purchased from outside vendors. Students learn how to run a business through our

fundraisers and make items they can be proud to sell. We will be pre-selling these items for two weeks with delivery in the middle of October. 


