- Congratulations – to the following students who achieved the honor of being named **National Merit Semifinalists: Madison Lee, Susan Mallen, Jordan Rotz, Sebastian Suarez, and Tyler Williams.**
- **Teacher of the Year – 9th Grade Center - is Heather Parker.** Ms. Parker is a Math teacher who provides high-quality instruction for our students and serves as a leader and mentor to other math teachers. She also offers additional technical support for many teachers on campus.
- **Teacher of the Year - Main Campus - is Lisa Nix.** Ms. Nix is our school media specialist. She creates such a welcoming environment in our media center – students choose to study and collaborate in the media center before school, during lunch, and after school hours because of the warm atmosphere established by Ms. Nix. She is also an integral part of our testing team and instructional leadership team.
- **Support Person of the Year – 9th Grade Center - is Bob Walker.** Mr. Walker provides outstanding customer service for our students, parents, and staff. His technical expertise and willingness to assist in other areas like supervision, fixed asset management, and testing support make him an important asset to our school.
- **Support Person of the Year - Main Campus - is Trenette Dahlke.** Ms. Dahlke is our school secretary. She is an integral part of daily operations in our front office. She communicates with students, staff, parents, and community members on a daily bases, while providing excellent customer service.
- **PTSA –** has once again been recognized as a **School of Excellence** by the National PTA. This distinction was awarded to only 45 high schools in the nation.

We are fortunate to have outstanding parent and community support. Our PTSA volunteers their time for so many events and functions. They raise support to provide teacher grants in order to enhance academic programs. They provide assistance for families in need, and they reward our teachers/staff throughout the year in various ways. Here are some important dates and reminders:

- **Bright Futures update** - Counselors visited the senior Government and Economics classes to help students complete the Florida Financial Aid Application. There are over 14 different grants and scholarships in this application, including Bright Futures. Students who have not completed this application will receive an email to visit the College and Career Center for help completing it.
- **FAFSA** – Seniors should be completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. They can visit the College & Career Center for additional assistance with college and/or career information, FAFSA completion, or scholarship applications.
- **Khan Academy** – is an online resource that helps students prepare for the SAT. With 20 hours of practice, the average increase for students is 90 points. Students who need help linking their Collegeboard account to Khan Academy can stop by the College and Career Center.
- **Peterson's Test Prep** - is another online test prep option for the SAT, ACT, and the ASVAB. This link is located in the Media Center section of the Student Canvas page under databases and research.
- **Winter Concerts**

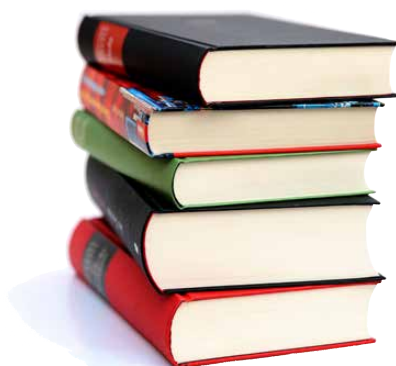

Student Services

- Counselors have open office hours for students every day during lunch and of course, by appointment.
- All seniors have had an individual meeting with their school counselors to review graduation requirements and post-secondary plans.
- Seniors also completed their Bright Futures application and created FSA ID in class. We highly encourage all students to complete the FAFSA to determine whether they qualify for Financial aid to attend a college or technical school.
- Counselors visited all sophomore and junior classes. Academic timelines, graduation requirements, testing information, dual enrollment, post-secondary plans, and tutoring options were discussed.
- The College and Career Center has been open extra hours to ensure seniors meet their college application deadlines. Volunteers and staff have been available to assist with essays, college visits, and scholarship applications
- In October, the Student Services Team conducted separate grade level virtual parent presentations. If you missed them, the recordings are posted on the Student Canvas page.
- Students and parents can follow the WPHS College and Career Instagram Account (@WPHS_CCC) to receive information on scholarships, college visits, community service opportunities, and much more. Other important senior information can be accessed by following @WPSeniors on Instagram. We will also communicate via the Student Body Canvas page and on SCOIR
- In January and February, counselors will meet with students individually to complete registration for classes for the 2022-23 school year.
- The Junior SAT day is March 23, 2022.


